#### USDA – National Agricultural Statistical Service Iowa Field Office

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#### Cattle on Feed

**Iowa:** There were 1,175,000 cattle on feed for the slaughter market in all feedlots in Iowa on September 1, 2010, down 2 percent from August 1, 2010 and from September 1, 2009. Feedlots with a capacity greater than 1,000 head had 560,000 head on feed, equal to last month, but up 10 percent from last year. Feedlots with a capacity less than 1,000 head had 615,000 head on feed, down 5 percent from last month and down 10 percent from last year.

Placements during August totaled 158,000 head, up 41 percent from last month and up 7 percent from last year. Feedlots with a capacity greater than 1,000 head placed 93,000 head, up 35 percent from last month and up 26 percent from last year. Feedlots with a capacity less than 1,000 head placed 65,000 head. This is up 51 percent from last month, but down 11 percent from last year.

Marketings for August were 183,000 head, up 15 percent from last month and last year. Feedlots with a capacity greater than 1,000 head marketed 91,000 head, up 18 percent from last month and up 25 percent from last year. Feedlots with a capacity less than 1,000 head marketed 92,000 head, up 12 percent from last month and up 8 percent from last year. Other disappearance totaled 5,000 head.

#### **Hogs & Pigs Inventory**

**Iowa:** On September 1, there were 19.3 million hogs and pigs on Iowa farms, up almost 3 percent from the 18,800 in June 2010, but down 2 percent from a year ago.

The June - August 2010 pig crop was 4.68 million head. A total of 470,000 sows farrowed with an average litter size of 9.95 pigs per sow.

As of September 1, producers planned to farrow 470,000 head of sows and gilts in the September - November 2010 quarter. Farrowing intentions for the December 2010 – February 2011 period were estimated at 475,000 as of September 1, 2010.

**United States:** U.S. inventory of all hogs and pigs on September 1, 2010 was 65.0 million head. This was down 3 percent from September 1, 2009 but up 1 percent from June 1, 2010.

Breeding inventory, at 5.77 million head, was down 2 percent from last year and down slightly from the previous quarter. Market hog inventory, at 59.2 million head, was down 3 percent from last year, but up 1 percent from last quarter.

The June-August 2010 pig crop, at 28.5 million head, was down 1 percent from 2009 and down 3 percent from 2008. Sows farrowing during this period totaled 2.91 million head, down 2 percent from 2009 and down 6 percent from 2008. The sows farrowed during this quarter represented 50 percent of the breeding herd. The average pigs saved per litter was 9.81 for the June-August 2010 period, compared to 9.70 last year. The litter rate equaled the record for pigs saved per litter set during the March-May 2010 period. Pigs saved per litter by size of operation ranged from 7.80 for operations with 1-99 hogs and pigs to 9.90 for operations with more than 5,000 hogs and pigs.

U.S. hog producers intend to have 2.88 million sows farrow during the September-November 2010 quarter, down 1 percent from the actual farrowings during the same period in 2009 and down 5 percent from 2008. Intended farrowings for December 2010-February 2011, at 2.89 million sows, are up slightly from 2010, but down 4 percent from 2009.

The total number of hogs under contract owned by operations with over 5,000 head, but raised by contractees, accounted for 43 percent of the total U.S. hog inventory, down from 46 percent last year.

#### **GRAIN STOCKS**

Iowa: The September 1 on and off farm stocks of old crop corn were 15 percent higher than last year. The June-August 2010 indicated disappearance is 477 million bushels, down 13 percent from the same period last year.

Old crop soybean stocks in all positions on September 1, 2010 totaled 38.1 million bushels, up 26 percent from September 1, 2009. Indicated disappearance for June-August 2010 totaled 84.9 million bushels.
