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Welcome to the 2003 Iowa Health Fact Book!

This book is the fourth in a series of Iowa Health Fact Book biennial publications and has been produced as a collaborative effort between the The University of Iowa College of Public Health and the Iowa Department of Public Health. In it you will find information related to the current and future health of Iowans, such as data on disease incidence and mortality, health and social behaviors, health resources, and environmental factors. By compiling this type of information into one publication, we present a tool that is useful to Iowa's health care providers, health policy-makers, public health practitioners, and health researchers alike.

The Iowa Health Fact Books in 1997, 1999, and 2001 were distributed to registrants at the Governor's Conference on Public Health (Barn Raisings I, II, and III). In 1997 and 1999, it was produced as a printed book, while the 2001 version was distributed in a PDF file format on CD-ROMs. All have been available via the College of Public Health Website. This year, all participants of the Barn Raising IV, to be held in August 2003, will again receive the CD-ROM version free, and this version will also be posted on our college website. A limited number of printed copies of the 2003 edition will be available at a moderate cost for those who prefer a bound book. Note that the pages of the book can be printed from the PDF files or from the website.

The format of the 2003 Fact Book follows closely to that of the past editions, allowing users the ability to track changes over time. As we continue this effort over the years, we are in a better position to track changes longitudinally. You will notice a greater number of graphs showing trends over longer periods of time. Like the previous editions, however, we present the data in a descriptive format, without analysis and interpretation of trends. The interested reader is free to use these data in his/her own analyses, and is encouraged to do so with care and attention paid to analytic issues such as small counts and possible changes in the way the data are collected. The data source is given for each type of information presented, and those responsible for collecting the data can address any questions you may have. You will also find a list of other health information resources and their contact information in the Appendix.

We are pleased to make this rich source of health information available to the public and hope that you find it useful.

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Fact Book Conventions

Layout

In the 2003 Iowa Health Fact Book, state-wide data relating to health outcomes, social and health behaviors and health care resources are presented, generally at the county level. The data have been compiled in this book, but were collected using different methodologies by different organizations and reporting mechanisms. The time interval covered differs across the data items, mainly due to differences in data availability. Where reasonable and possible, county-specific data are presented. When it is not presented in that format, it is either because the data were too sparse (that is, a relatively small number of counties with non-zero counts) or not available at the county level. Since many of the data items presented would be expected to vary with county population size, the counties have been organized into groups based on their average annual population size between 1992 and 2000 to facilitate comparisons. Both crude and age-adjusted population rates are presented when reasonable, also to facilitate comparisons across counties. For data items in which historical counts earlier than those presented in this book are available, line graphs showing time trends by county grouping are presented as well.

Four County Groupings

Eighteen counties were grouped as having an average annual population of less than 10,000 (group 1); 45 counties had an average annual population between 10,000 and 20,000 (group 2); 26 counties were non-MSA counties with an average population over 20,000 (group 3); and 10 counties were classified as MSA counties (group 4). An MSA (Metropolitan Statistical Area) county is defined by the Census Bureau as one city with at least 50,000 inhabitants or a Census-defined urbanized area with a total metropolitan population of at least 100,000 (75,000 in New England). There were some changes in these groupings when compared to the 2001 Iowa Health Fact Book.

Small Numbers

If the number of county-specific events in a health outcome tables was less than five, we mask the count by replacing it with an asterisk (*) to protect subject confidentiality. This policy marks a change from the 2001 Iowa Health Fact Book, where numbers less than three were not reported. However, all numbers are included in the computations needed for the line graphs and other charts accompanying the health outcomes tables.

Population Standard

The Year 2000 Estimated United States Standard Million Population from the United States Census Bureau has been used for adjustment purposes.

Adjustment Calculations

Both crude and age-adjusted rates have been calculated and presented in many of the data tables. Crude rates for an entity, e.g. county, are the number of events of a health outcome divided by the population at risk in the county. The age-adjusted rates used in this book are a weighted average of the age-specific rates from the targeted population (e.g., county), where the weights are the proportions of persons in the corresponding age groups of a standard population. As stated above, the Year 2000 United States population was used as the standard population.

There are no hard and fast rules as to when one should use either the crude or the adjusted rate for comparisons. A few guidelines can, however, be noted. A crude rate for a county reflects the disease or mortality burden for a county and may be useful to the health policy makers in the county. If a county has a relatively high proportion of elderly and the disease is associated with older individuals, crude rates will reflect that higher burden due to greater numbers of elderly. The age-adjusted rate is also useful as a county comparison index, but after putting both counties on the same playing field with respect to the age distribution in each. These rates have been adjusted to the same standard population, so the effect of differing age distributions in two counties is eliminated before the comparison is made. Hence, both are useful descriptive indices of diseases, but with differences in interpretation.

Ranks

Marking a change from the 2001 Iowa Health Fact Book, county ranks of crude and adjusted rates are presented in this year's edition. The county rank represents the ranking of the county among the 99 counties of Iowa, with a rank of "1" given to the county with the largest rate and "99" to the county with the smallest rate. In general, ranks are presented for a data table when no counts in the table are less than five; i.e. when there are no very small numbers. For the health care provider and health care facility data, ranks are not presented if the state total is less than 1,000 or if more than one county has a zero count.

Healthy People 2010 Leading Indicators

The Healthy People 2010 Leading Health Indicators have been included in the 2003 Iowa Health Fact Book to help correlate important indicators of health with available data sources and results.

Healthy People 2010 includes 467 objectives that will be tracked to measure progress throughout the decade. However, to help everyone more easily understand the importance of health promotion and disease prevention and to encourage wide participation in improving health, a small set of Leading Health Indicators was selected. These Leading Health Indicators reflect the major public health concerns in the United States and were chosen based on their ability to motivate action, the availability of data to measure their progress, and their relevance as broad public health issues.

Specific Healthy People 2010 objectives will be used to track progress on each of the Leading Health Indicators. The following table lists the specific objectives for each indicator, the national baseline figure and the source of the national rate. It also lists the state baseline figure and source for all except four of the objectives. We are still seeking state level information that is comparable for those four.

One objective of Healthy People initiative was the development of a consensus set of health status indicators for use at the national, state, and local level. Iowa has been tracking this set of health status indicators for the past decade and will continue in the current decade. Priority in selecting these Health Status Indicators was given to measures for which data was readily available at the local, state, and national level. The Health Status Indicators predominantly reflect outcomes, while many of the Leading Health Indicators reflect behaviors.

Demographics

Many of the health indicators in the 2003 Iowa Health Fact Book are presented with rates calculated using the population of the county and state. These rates are also stratified into population subgroups based on the average annual size of the county from 1992 to 2000. This not only contrasts the rural and urban aspects of the state but also includes trends in age and ethnic distribution of the population. The Year 2000 US standard population age distribution is used for calculating age-adjusted rates. Population estimates have been obtained from the US Census via the National Cancer Institute's SEER*Stat software program. Estimates are used for each year and year groupings where appropriate.

Using the average annual population from 1992-2000, there were 18 counties with less than 10,000 population, 45 counties with 10,000 to 20,000 residents, 26 counties with 20,000 to 50,000 residents, and 10 Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) counties. The distribution of the population by age is different between the county groupings. The larger size counties have a greater percentage of their population as young adults (15-44 years) compared to the small counties. The small counties have a larger percentage of persons 65 years of age or older. These differences in age distribution are standardized through age-adjustment so risk factors other than age can be compared. As shown, the population of the state has become older since 1970. The percent of Iowans age 65 and older increased steadily through the early 1990's, but has slightly decreased since then.

Average Annual Population Distribution by Age: 1990-2000



Health and Social Behaviors

The health of individuals and their communities is determined by a variety of factors including biologic, environmental, social, and behavioral influences. This section provides an overview of selected surveys and statistics collected in Iowa to track the effects of these various influences on the health of Iowans. Introductions are provided individually for each of the surveys with links to more detailed information on survey methodology and additional data where available. Information on marriages, dissolutions, and crime statistics is included at the end of this section because it characterizes and contrasts the population dynamics that can affect health.

QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER WHEN USING SURVEY RESULTS...

- ✓ What was the method used to conduct the survey, i.e., telephone, mail, personal interview?
- ✓ What was the response rate of those surveyed and what factors might influence who responds and who doesn't?
- ✓ Are the survey respondents representative of and thus generalizable to a particular population?
- ✓ Because a survey provides only estimates based on the sampled population, what are the variability measures of these estimates?
- ✓ Were the survey questions cross-sectional in that they represent attitudes, behaviors, or disease status of different people, or were the same people surveyed repeatedly over time?

Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS)

The Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) survey is an ongoing telephone survey that is conducted each year in every state, including Iowa, as well as in the District of Columbia, and in Puerto Rico. It is financially and technically supported by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and is a scientifically-designed and validated method of collecting information.

The Iowa BRFSS collects health risk behavior information from 3,600 household telephone surveys, and is designed to collect information on nationally agreed upon topics and on additional areas of special interest to Iowa. Because the BRFSS is conducted annually, the prevalence of these behaviors may be followed longitudinally. The risk behaviors of those surveyed (Iowa residents age 18 and over) are major contributions to illness, disability, and premature death.

The goal of the Iowa BRFSS is to provide data to initiate and guide health promotion disease prevention programs. The BRFSS program achieves this goal by:

1. determining state specific prevalence of personal health behaviors related to the leading cause of premature death;
2. developing the capacity of the state health department to conduct credible telephone surveys; and
3. advancing the understanding that health-related behaviors are critical indices of health.

The BRFSS results can help inform health professionals as to health behaviors and beliefs of the general population, and can be used as a measure of the effectiveness of various public health strategies.

2002 Iowa Youth Tobacco Survey (IYTS)

The Iowa Youth Tobacco Survey (IYTS) supplies vital information that guides tobacco-use prevention programs. The survey results serve as a guide to help evaluate current efforts to reduce tobacco use among younger Iowans. The Iowa Department of Public Health Division of Tobacco Use Prevention and Control, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in Atlanta, along with many other organizations and school districts implemented this survey in the spring of 2002. The IYTS used a random sample of 60 schools to participate in the 2002 IYTS: 30 middle schools (grades 6 through 8) and 30 high schools (grades 9 through 12). A multistage sampling design was used. Twenty-seven of the middle schools and 25 of

There were 1,848 middle school students selected to participate and 1,633 (88%) completed a useable questionnaire. There were 1,937 high school students selected to participate and 1,697 (88%) completed a useable questionnaire. Iowa Youth Survey

The 2002 Iowa Youth survey was a joint project among the Iowa Department of Public Health Division of Health Promotion, Prevention and Addictive Behaviors; Iowa Department of Human Rights Division of Criminal & Juvenile Justice Planning; Iowa Governor's Office of Drug Control Policy; Iowa Department of Education; Iowa Workforce Development; and The Higher Plain, Inc.

Survey scope. The 2002 IYS is the 10th in a series of youth surveys that have been completed every three years since 1975. The 1999 and 2002 surveys differ from previous years in both the procedures used to implement the survey and the students who were asked to participate. Previous surveys were given to approximately one-third of Iowa's public school districts and a sample of their 6th, 8th, 10th and 12th grade students. Starting with the 1999 IYS, participation was sought from all public school districts and all students in grades 6, 8 and 11, as well as 14-18 year-old students in alternative programs. These changes make it possible to provide youth development-related data for each participating school, as well as for each county in which participating students reside. They also make it more feasible to use IYS results to assess the outcome of community and school youth development programs. The changes do, however, restrict direct comparisons with surveys prior to 1999 to grades 6 and 8, and to the schools that participated in those surveys.

Starting with the 2002 IYS, participation was also sought from all non-public schools in the state, in addition to all of the public school districts. It was believed that by including all Iowa students in the 6th, 8th and 11th grades, the survey results would more accurately reflect the attitudes and perceptions of all Iowa students in those grades, not just those attending public schools. These non-public school data have been included in this report.

Some survey questionnaires were completed in 349 of Iowa's 371 public school districts (94.1%) and in a minimum of 49 of 178 private schools (27.5%) with some combination of students enrolled in the 6th, 8th and/or 11th grades. A total of 96,971 public and private school students across the state completed the IYS, with each county represented by at least 170 students, except Wayne County. Due to procedural errors in obtaining the survey forms and distributing the forms to the student-participants, the data from certain non-public schools were irretrievably commingled with the

public school data in four public school districts, thus it is not possible to calculate the actual number of public school students and non-public school students who completed surveys, or the exact number of private schools that submitted surveys.

Survey content. The 2002 IYS questionnaire includes questions about the students' behaviors and attitudes/beliefs, as well as their perceptions of their peer, family, school and neighborhood/community environments. Prior research has shown that each of these environments plays a significant role in positive youth development. Selection of specific survey questions was based on a combination of: 1) analysis of data collected in previous Iowa Youth Surveys; 2) a literature review of the established youth development models, especially those that enjoy some acceptance in Iowa; and 3) discussion sessions with youth development professionals (community service providers, school district personnel and academicians).

The general content of the questions included in the 2002 IYS is similar to that of previous surveys. Most of the items are relevant to the constructs on which previous IYS were based. All questions and responses from the 1999 IYS were utilized without modification, and several new questions added. Among the new additions were questions regarding certain prohibited activities on school property, the student's perceived career path upon finishing high school, and job and job seeking skills developed in school.

The appropriateness of any comparison between 1999 and 2002 surveys, and surveys from previous years must be considered on a question-by-question basis. Trend analyses for the most part should be considered exploratory at best. If comparisons are made, the 1999 and 2002 reports may make the state *appear* to be significantly different, for better or worse, from the reports generated by previous surveys. This appearance may be due to differences in question wording between the 1999/2002 reports and all previous reports and the representativeness of the samples rather than to actual changes in Iowa's youth. Further, the 2002 IYS state report contains data from over 2,200 non-public school students who did not participate in the 1999 IYS. These students equate to 2.3% of the usable IYS surveys received, and thus may have some impact on the state level data.

Substance Abuse Treatment

Substance abuse treatment is provided to all 99 counties in Iowa using funding from the Alcohol and Drug Abuse and Mental Health Services block grant, state substance abuse appropriations, and Medicaid. Iowa operates under a managed care system which is currently administered by Magellan Behavioral Care of Iowa (MBCI). MBCI contracts with a total of 64 service providers in 22 service areas as represented on the map and listing on the next page. The 64 service providers include 32 who receive funding from both IDPH and Medicaid, and 32 who are funded through Medicaid only. Services are available to all Iowans regardless of their ability to pay or financial status through a sliding-fee schedule.

The tables on the following pages represent all admissions to substance abuse treatment programs regardless of source of funding for that specific client. The data for each county is divided by adult (18 and over) and adolescent (17 and under), and by primary substance of abuse.


The reporting period was for calendar years 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, and 2002. The numbers reflect those identifying a county of residence in Iowa. Those identifying their residence outside of Iowa were not counted. The count is unduplicated with the following exceptions: a client was counted twice if their primary substance of abuse changed between admissions or if the client's age changed between admissions.

Alcohol Admissions: Adolescent 1998-2002












Marriages 1998-2001




Domestic Abuse Cases 1999-2001




Juvenile Arrests 1999-2001

Prenatal and Infant Health

Each year families across the United States bring home a healthy baby who has all the potential for a full and productive life. But some families will suffer the loss of their child soon after birth.

Infant morbidity and mortality are critical indicators of the health of a population. Low birth weight and preterm birth result in a significant loss of life; surviving infants often sustain residual injuries that affect quality of life, and there is substantial financial cost to individuals and to society in caring for these children.

Certain factors have proven to increase the likelihood of delivering a low birth weight or preterm infant, such as (1) cigarette smoking during pregnancy; (2) substance abuse immediately prior to conception and during pregnancy (including alcohol abuse); and (3) teenage pregnancies.

Birth defects rank as the leading cause of mortality in full-term newborn babies in the United States. Iowa's overall birth defect rate is approximately 5% of all births. The state of Iowa has taken a leadership role in birth defect surveillance and serves as a model to other states. Iowa has also partnered with the March of Dimes' Folic Acid education campaign and the Preterm Birth Prevention campaign.

Adequate folic acid intake by women of reproductive years has been demonstrated to decrease the risk of neural tube defects in children. Early prenatal care for mothers and health education to women and medical providers allow for a healthier pregnancy and improved birth outcomes.

Interventions need to focus on providing preconceptional health care to women, early and comprehensive prenatal care, and family support that includes promotion of healthy lifestyles.




Mothers Under Age 20 1989-2001








Fetal Deaths 1989-2001




Perinatal Deaths 1989-2001





Infectious Diseases

Fifty-one specific infectious diseases are listed as reportable conditions in Iowa Administrative Code 641, Chapter 1, although many others are reportable as rare or unusual diseases. Disease surveillance is conducted by the Bureau of Disease Prevention and

Immunization for STDs, HIV/AIDS, and Tuberculosis and by the Center for Acute Disease Epidemiology (CADE) for other reportable conditions. Local public health nurses or disease prevention specialists, in conjunction with the staff epidemiologists at the Iowa Department of Public Health, interview persons with selected conditions or diseases and conduct

investigations of disease outbreaks. Disease control is appropriately instituted including recall of contaminated food, vaccinations, and partner counseling/referral services to all persons reported with sexually transmitted diseases.

Drastic increases in reported cases of certain infectious diseases are often the result of specific outbreak situations. Increases in Hepatitis A cases reported from 1996–1998 were due to outbreaks in Woodbury (1996) and Polk (1997-1998) counties and were related to transmission among methamphetamine users. The increase in pertussis cases in 1997 occurred mainly in grade school children in Johnson County. Pertussis continues to be a concern. Reported sporadic cases are at times used to identify large pockets of pertussis in an area. In 2002 counties with greater than 30 cases of pertussis were Johnson and Linn. The outbreak of rubella in 1999 originated in a Hispanic migrant worker population.

Immunization clinics were held in a number of packing plants across the state to contain the outbreak. In 2002, Cherokee county had a food-borne outbreak due to *Salmonella enteritis* with at least 47 persons becoming ill. Emerging infectious disease threats were also addressed such as West Nile encephalitis and antibiotic resistance.

Sexually Transmitted Diseases² 2000-2002



Cancer Incidence and Mortality

Cancer is the second leading cause of death in Iowa. From 1990 through 2000, 70,234 Iowans died from cancer and 165,106 cancers were newly diagnosed. During this period, cancer accounted for about one of every four deaths in Iowa. Although it occurs in people of all ages, more than 80 percent of new cancers occur in those 55 years of age and older.

For all sites of cancer incidence and mortality, the age-adjusted rates by county grouping increased as the average population increased. The crude rates, however, show the opposite trend, as these rates were highest in counties with average populations < 10,000. This reflects a larger proportion of older people in the smaller, more rural counties (see tables and graph in Demographics). During the 1990s, The U.S. has experienced a decline in cancer mortality, reflected also in Iowa. Today, less than half of Iowans newly diagnosed with a cancer will die from it. Survival rates,

urinary bladder, and kidney and renal pelvis. Alcohol consumption is also a known risk factor for cancers of the oral cavity (excluding lip), esophagus, and larynx. Ongoing research indicates that dietary factors may play an important role in the occurrence of cancers of the prostate and colorectum. Other important risk factors include obesity for cancer of the uterine corpus, excessive sunlight exposure for skin melanoma, and genetic predisposition (or positive family history) for breast cancer.

The Iowa Cancer Registry has been recording the occurrence of cancer in Iowa since 1973. It receives mortality data from the Iowa Department of Public Health (IDPH). The Registry's incidence and IDPH's mortality databases have been used to generate the cancer incidence and cancer mortality statistics provided in this section of the 2003 Iowa Health Fact Book via a software program called SEER*Stat, which is provided by the National Cancer Institute.

































































Cervical Cancer Incidence 1990-2000







Injury Mortality

Transportation-related mortality accounted for 5,707 deaths in Iowa, 91% of which were motor vehicle fatalities, from 1990-2000. The rates for these fatalities are highest in the rural counties and lowest in the most urban counties. Crude rates for suicide, firearm mortality, and falls mortality tend to be highest in rural counties, but the age-adjusted rates are more similar for the county groups. Homicide rates are consistently higher in the urban counties. Poisoning mortality rates have shown much variation across years for each county group. The state's mortality rate from burns has increased in recent years after decreasing from 1979-1998. In general, drowning deaths

have consistently decreased across all county levels since 1979. Deaths from all other unintentional injuries are difficult to compare for 1999-2000 and preceding years due to changes in the mortality classification systems (discussed below).

Beginning in 1999, the tenth revision of the International Classification of Diseases (ICD-10) replaced the ninth version (ICD-9) as the standard mortality classification system. ICD-10 is more detailed than ICD-9; ICD-10 has about 8,000 categories while ICD-9 has about 5,000 categories. Also, some of the coding rules and rules for selecting the underlying cause of death have changed. Because of the new classification system, observed changes in mortality rates between 1999-2000 and preceding years could be due, in part, to changes in the method of mortality classification. Therefore, one should compare rates from 1999-2000 and preceding years with caution. The ICD-9 and ICD-10 codes used for each type of Injury Mortality are listed in the appendix.

The source of this mortality data is the cause of death data obtained from death certificates filed at the Iowa Department of Public Health. Analysis was done by the State Health Registry of Iowa and the Center for Public Health Statistics at the University of Iowa. Age-adjusted rates were calculated using the Year 2000 US population distribution.





Motor Vehicle Traffic Mortality 1990-2000





Suicide Mortality 1990-2000





Firearms Mortality 1990-2000









Poisoning Mortality 1990-2000







Drowning Mortality 1990-2000







Youth Injury Mortality

Injuries remain the leading cause of death in persons age 1-34 years and contribute the most to years of life lost (YLL), particularly for those events of pre-adult ages. Deaths from unintentional injuries, homicides and suicides are important public health problems in those 15-24 years of age and many of these deaths are preventable.

Transportation fatalities accounted for 377 deaths for youth aged 0-14 from 1990-2000. Of these, 90% were due to motor vehicle traffic death. In the 15-19 age range, 800 transportation deaths occurred over this same period with 97% accounted for by motor vehicle traffic deaths. In general, transportation mortality rates are higher in the more rural counties for both age groups. For 15-19 year-olds, the mortality rate was drastically higher in rural counties for the 1996-2000 time period. Tables for suicide and homicide are not presented due to the small number of events in both age ranges.

The source of the cause of death data is obtained from death certificates filed at the Iowa Department of Public Health. Analysis was done by the State Health Registry of Iowa at the University of Iowa. Age-adjusted rates were calculated using the Year 2000 U.S. population distribution.

Note that the crude and age-adjusted rates displayed in the graphs for ages 15-19 are identical to one another. This is because only one age group in the age-adjustment analysis is represented. The crude and age-adjusted rates for the 0-14 age group show slight differences as this represents four age groups (<1, 1-4, 5-9, and 10-14) in the age-adjustment analysis.













Age 15-19: Motor Vehicle Traffic Mortality by County Group 1979-2000




Age 0-14: Suicide by County Group 1979-2000**Crude Rates****Age-Adjusted Rates**











Other Mortality

With the population aging, chronic disease has become a major determinant of the health of Iowans and the need for health care services in the state.

Heart disease, still the number one cause of death in Iowa, accounted for 323 deaths per 100,000 persons (crude rate) between 1990 and 2000. Using age-adjusted rates, the four county groupings (based on county size) do not vary much, but we do see a consistent decline over time. In the 1978 to 1983 period, the state age-adjusted mortality rate was 365 per 100,000, whereas it had dropped steadily to 249 per 100,000 by the 1996-2000 time period.

Cancer is still the second leading cause of death in Iowa, with a crude mortality rate of 223 per 100,000. Iowa, like the rest of the country, experienced an increase in age-adjusted mortality rates in the late 1970s and 1980s, but a decline in the 1990s, returning us to a rate of 191.7 per 100,000 in 1996-2000, compared to 193.0 in 1978-1983.

From 1978 through 1990, we experienced an steady decline in age-adjusted stroke mortality, but it remained relatively constant between 1990 and 2000. The age-adjusted mortality rates for chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) have been increasing across time with the larger counties experiencing the highest rates. Death from pneumonia and influenza shows little overall change over time, when adjusted for age, but unadjusted rates indicate a greater problem in the smaller counties, due to their larger proportion of elderly. The smaller counties are also exhibiting a greater problem with mortality due to diabetes, atherosclerosis, kidney diseases, and Alzheimer's disease, based upon crude mortality rates.

These data were obtained from death certificates filed at the Iowa Department of Public Health via the National Center for Health Statistics and the NCI SEER Stat program.





Heart Disease Mortality 1990-2000





































Health Care Providers

The Office of Statewide Clinical Education Programs (OSCEP) at The University of Iowa Carver College of Medicine, the Iowa Department of Public Health, Board of Nursing, and the Bureau of Emergency Medical Services collect the health care provider data presented in this Iowa Health Fact Book.

The OSCEP provides an up-to-date inventory of physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, pharmacists, and dentists, which facilitates tracking trends in Iowa health professionals and provides feedback to the health science colleges on progress of their programs.

The Board of Nursing enforces and regulates nursing education, nursing practice, and continuing education for nurses. It sets standards, provides evaluation and licensing, and investigates complaints about licensed practical nurses, registered nurses, and advanced registered nurse practitioners. Its mission is “to protect the public health, safety and welfare of Iowans by ensuring that nursing is practiced by competent licensed individuals within their practice field.” Data related to the nursing supply are housed within the Board of Nursing.

The Bureau of Emergency Medical Services (EMS) is a regulatory agency that establishes initial training, continuing education, and renewal requirements leading to certification of emergency medical care providers, including those presented here. The EMS Bureau is also responsible for the authorization and regulation of EMS service programs (levels First Responder through Paramedic), and a statewide trauma system. In addition, the Bureau has statewide programs dealing with system development initiatives, injury prevention, and emergency medical services for children.

Seventeen other licensing boards are housed at the Iowa Department of Public Health which collects data about practice, licensing/certification, and other supply information.





Crude Rates, 2001 and 2003








Crude Rates, 2001 and 2003



Internal Medicine Physicians Practicing





Pediatric Physicians Practicing





Obstetrics/Gynecology Physicians Practicing





Crude Rates, 2001 and 2003








Total Physicians Practicing




Crude Rates, 2001 and 2003



Physician Assistants Practicing







Crude Rates, 2001 and 2003







Crude Rates, 2001 and 2003














Emergency Medical Technicians - Intermediate Licensed



Crude Rates, 2001 and 2003




Emergency Medical Technicians - Paramedic Licensed







Emergency Medical Technicians - Paramedic Specialist Licensed





Health Care Facilities

The information presented on health care facilities comes from the Division of Health Facilities in the Iowa Department of Inspections and Appeals (DIA). This state agency is responsible for inspection of all Chapter 135C licensed health care facilities in Iowa, including those presented in the 2003 Iowa Health Fact Book. Under state law the DIA is responsible for the inspection and licensure of Hospitals (135B), Birth Centers (135G), Hospices (135J) and Psychiatric Medical Institutes for Children (135H). This agency also conducts inspections of various Medicare/Medicaid entities (e.g., skilled nursing facilities, home health agencies, hospices, hospitals, CLIA labs, etc.) through contract with the Health Care Financing Administration (HCFA), and investigates complaints of substandard care or services in these entities. There is only one Intermediate Care Facility for Persons with Mental Illness in Iowa (a 25-bed unit in Davis County), so unlike previous editions of the Iowa

Health Fact Book, statewide data for this type of facility is not presented.

Community and Migrant Health Centers

Community and migrant health centers provide affordable, accessible, and acceptable primary health care to Iowans. These centers primarily serve indigent, medically-underserved and under-insured populations and assist special populations through grants and programs.


Community and migrant health centers are the safety net providers. They provide several health services to the community, including comprehensive health services with a variety of physician specialties, general dentistry and community health programs involving oral health education and dental screening, prenatal care, family planning, health screenings, immunizations, case management and pharmacies. Centers may be affiliated with a regional health system that can provide access to substantial support systems.

Community Health Centers are funded by Section 330 funds of the Public Health Service Act and Iowa has eight such centers (plus the Des Moines Health Center, which provides similar services). They are required to provide primary health services, dental services, mental health services, prevention, education, and case management. Patients cannot be turned away on the basis of ability to pay. A sliding fee scale based on income is mandated. The C/MHC model is a non-profit corporation whose board members must be members of the community and at least one percent of the board must be patients of the health center. 
Certified Rural Health Clinics and Community Health Centers

A rural health clinic is a clinic located in a rural area designated as a shortage area for personal health service and/or primary medical care manpower. In July of 2003, there were a total of 129 certified rural health clinics in Iowa (Iowa Department of Inspections and Appeals), located in 53 of our 99 counties. Such a clinic is neither a rehabilitation agency nor a facility primarily for the care and treatment of mental diseases. Patient services are furnished by a physician's assistant or nurse practitioner at least 50 percent of the time the clinic operates. The definition of such is found in Title 42 in the Code of Federal Regulations. Rural Health Clinics receive enhanced reimbursement for Medicare.






Hospital Beds




Crude Rates, 2001 and 2003



Nursing Facility Beds






Beds in Chronic Confusion or Dementing Illness Units



Crude Rates, 2001 and 2003




Intermediate Care Facilities for the Mentally Retarded






Intermediate Care Beds for the Mentally Retarded




Crude Rates, 2001 and 2003






Beds in Residential Care Facilities




Crude Rates, 2001 and 2003



Residential Care Facilities for Persons with Mental Illness





Beds in Residential Care Facilities for Persons with Mental Illness








Beds in Residential Care Facilities for the Mentally Retarded




Crude Rates, 2001 and 2003



3-5 Bed Units for the Mentally Retarded





Beds in 3-5 Bed Units for the Mentally Retarded





Psychiatric Medical Institutions for Children





Beds in Psychiatric Medical Institutions for Children





Total Trauma Facilities





Community Trauma Care Facilities





Area Trauma Care Facilities




Crude Rates, 2001 and 2003



Regional Trauma Care Facilities





Environmental Health Indicators

Whether we consider global warming or water quality, it is clear that our environment affects us both directly and indirectly. While some environmental health issues have existed since the beginning of the human race, most have become evident in the last few centuries. These problems have emerged as a result of our growing and changing population. The industrial revolution has created air and water pollution problems as well as overcrowding and sanitation issues. As of July 2003, over 6.3 billion people inhabited the earth.

The environment plays a role in many health issues previously discussed including birth defects, cancer, respiratory diseases, and many infectious diseases. Other concerns include allergies, fertility, and exposure to animal and insect vectors. In Iowa, public health officials are especially concerned with pesticide toxicity, water quality in rural areas, and nitrate in municipal drinking water.

As we attempt to provide food, water, and shelter for the world's population, we must remain aware of how our actions affect our local and global environment. At the same time, we must monitor and attempt to prevent any adverse health conditions that are caused by interactions with the environment.

This is a new section for the Iowa Health Fact Book, and as such, includes only data on childhood lead poisoning. We hope to include other environmental health indicators as well in future editions.

Childhood Blood Lead Poisoning

Childhood lead poisoning has significant effects on the health of children and on community health. Lead has adverse effects on nearly all organ systems in the body. It is especially harmful to the developing brains and nervous systems of children under the age of six years. At very high blood lead levels, children can suffer severe brain damage or even die. At blood lead levels as low as 10 micrograms per deciliter ($\mu\text{g}/\text{dL}$), a child's intelligence, hearing, and growth are affected. In a community, the presence of lead-poisoned children can be associated with an increase in the number of children with developmental deficits and learning disorders. This places an unnecessary and expensive burden on the educational system. The presence of lead-poisoned children also requires substantial community public health resources for medical and environmental case management services.

High blood lead levels have adverse effects on nearly all organ systems in the body, and are especially harmful to children.

Most cases of childhood lead poisoning are caused by lead-based paint, which is found in most homes built before 1960. Young children who live in pre-1960 homes become lead-poisoned when they put paint chips or exterior soil in their mouths or when they get house dust and soil on their hands and put their hands in their mouths.

Although lead poisoning can cause serious health problems – including death – most lead-poisoned children demonstrate no visible symptoms. This makes it much more important to have an effective program to prevent childhood lead poisoning.

Most cases of childhood lead poisoning are caused by lead-based paints found in homes built before 1960.

Since 1992, the Iowa Department of Public Health (IDPH) has recommended that all children in Iowa under the age of six years be tested for lead poisoning. In addition, state and federal laws require that all children under the age of six and covered by Medicaid be tested for lead poisoning. In spite of this, the

statewide testing rates among children covered by Medicaid and children who are not covered by Medicaid are virtually identical.

In Iowa, blood lead testing is conducted by the Title V Child's Health Program, local health departments, and by many private physicians. The IDPH childhood blood lead level surveillance system tracks all testing in the state. Thus, blood lead testing results collected as required by Medicaid, as well as those collected from voluntary testing of non-Medicaid children are reported to IDPH.

In the following tables, data are presented for children who were born in calendar year 1992, 1993, 1994, 1995, and 1996 and who received at least one blood lead test before their sixth birthday. Children followed for blood lead poisoning may be tested multiple times. The test results that are presented in the following tables reflect the highest blood lead level for any particular child.

For each county, the number of children receiving a blood lead test who were identified with blood levels of 10.0 to 14.9 micrograms per deciliter ($\mu\text{g}/\text{dL}$), 15.0 to 19.9 $\mu\text{g}/\text{dL}$, 20.0 to 24.9 $\mu\text{g}/\text{dL}$, and greater than or equal to 25 $\mu\text{g}/\text{dL}$ are presented. A blood level of 10 $\mu\text{g}/\text{dL}$ has been identified by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention as the threshold for lead poisoning in children and is categorized as "high" for the graphs. Additional data, such as the percent of children in each birth cohort who were tested for lead poisoning, are also presented.

Since 1992, the Iowa Department of Public Health has recommended that all children under the age of six years be tested for lead poisoning.




Tested for Blood Lead: Children Born in 1992-1996

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Appendix II: Glossary of Terms

Glossary of Terms

Age-Adjusted Rate (Direct Method): A weighted average of the age-specific incidence or mortality rates from the targeted population(s) where the weights are the proportions of persons in the corresponding age groups of a standard population. In this document, the Year 2000 US population is used as the standard population. Calculating an age-adjusted rate allows for comparisons across targeted populations after accounting or “adjusting” for possible differences in the age-distribution of these populations.

Area Trauma Care Facility: Provides initial evaluation and stabilization, including surgical intervention for the severely injured patient. An area trauma care facility provides comprehensive inpatient services to patients who can be maintained in a stable or improving condition without specialized care. Critically injured patients who require specialized care are transferred to a resource or regional trauma care facility. An organized trauma team including a general surgeon, emergency physician, CRNA and/or anesthesiologist, nursing and ancillary personnel are promptly available to meet the patient upon arrival at the emergency department. The general surgeon, emergency physician, and ancillary personnel may be on-call from outside the hospital but with a clear commitment to meet a patient upon arrival at the emergency department when given timely notice by out-of-hospital EMS providers. Some area trauma care facilities elect to provide in-house 24-hour emergency physician coverage. In addition to direct patient care, area trauma care facilities provide community and outreach education and injury prevention programs.

Chronic Confusion or Dementing Illness Units: “Chronic Confusion or Dementing Illness” is a special license classification for nursing facilities or a special unit within such a facility providing care to persons who suffer from chronic confusion or dementing illness. Reference to Chronic Confusion or Dementing Illness Units is made in the acts and joint resolutions of the 1990 regular session of the Seventy-Third General Assembly of the State of Iowa.

Community Trauma Care Facility: Provides initial evaluation and stabilization of the severely injured patient. Stabilization may include surgical intervention. Most patients needing surgical intervention and/or specialty care are transferred to resource or regional trauma care facilities. Community trauma care facilities have the necessary equipment and diagnostic resources to resuscitate the severely injured patient. An organized team including a physician, nursing and ancillary personnel are promptly available to meet the patient upon arrival at the emergency department if given timely notice by out-of-hospital EMS providers. In addition to patient care, a community trauma care facility provides continuing education and injury prevention programs.

Crude Rate: The number of events or occurrences of disease in a give time period divided by the population at risk for that event or disease over the same time period.

Emergency Medical Technician – Basic: The EMT-B course emphasizes the development of student skills in patient assessment and examination; the recognition of signs and symptoms of illness or injury; proper procedures when rendering emergency medical care including patient assisted medications, automated external defibrillation, maintenance of a non-medicated IV, and the use of an advanced airway device. General topics covered include: human anatomy and physiology, bleeding and shock, bandaging and splinting, medical/behavior emergencies, obstetrics/gynecology, extrication from automobiles, farm, industrial and environmental emergencies, and ambulance operations.

Emergency Medical Technician – Intermediate: The EMT-I course involves additional training in patient assessment, intravenous therapy, advanced airway management techniques and automated defibrillation.

Emergency Medical Technician – Paramedic: This level covers additional emergency medical care skills including cardiac evaluation and treatment, medication effects and treatment, and advanced airway management techniques.

Emergency Medical Technician – Paramedic Specialist: This level identifies individuals who have successfully completed a program of training that used, as a minimum, the 1985 EMT-P national standard curriculum (NSC), plus documentation of completion of the objectives to the 1998 EMT-P NSC, or completed the 1998 EMT-P NSC and have successfully completed the department's testing requirements.

Fetal Death: A birth that fails to show any sign of life after delivery. Reportable fetal deaths in Iowa are those greater than 20 weeks gestation. The responsibility for determining if a birth meets this definition is that of the attending physician. "Fetal death" and "stillbirth" are synonymous terms.

First Responder: The First Responder is trained in patient stabilizing techniques and basic emergency medical care prior to the arrival of an ambulance. Skills in this program include patient assessment, vital signs, automated external defibrillation, oxygen delivery, and use of an advanced airway device.

Hospital: Any place which is devoted primarily to the maintenance of facilities for the diagnosis, treatment, or care of two or more non-related individuals suffering from illness, injury, or deformity for a period exceeding 24 hours. It is also a place which is devoted primarily to the rendering of obstetrical or other medical/nursing care for two or more non-related individuals for a period exceeding 24 hours. It can be any institution, place, building or agency in which any accommodation is primarily maintained, furnished or offered for the care of two or more non-related aged or infirmed person requiring or receiving chronic or convalescent care for a period exceeding 24 hours. Hospitals shall include sanitariums or other related institutions within the meaning of the federal Hill-Burton Act. A hospital shall include, in any event, any facilities wholly or partially constructed, or constructed with federal assistance pursuant to Public Law 725, 79th Congress, approved August 13, 1946. Definition is found in Title 42 in the Code of Federal Regulations and 135J of the Iowa Administrative Code.

Infant Death: Death of a liveborn infant under one year of age. This includes both neonatal and postneonatal deaths.

Intermediate Care Facilities for the Mentally Retarded: Institutions or distinct parts of institutions whose primary purpose is to provide health or rehabilitative services to three or more individuals who primarily have mental retardation or a related condition. Intermediate Care Facilities for the Mentally Retarded must meet the requirements of Iowa Code Chapter 135C and federal standards codified in 42 United States Code 1936d, which is contained in Title 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Part 483, Subpart D, 410-480. Definition is found in Chapter 135C of the Code of Iowa.

Intermediate Care Facilities for Persons with Mental Illness: Institutions, places, buildings or agencies whose primary purpose is to provide accommodation, board and nursing care for a period exceeding 24 consecutive hours to three or more individuals who primarily have mental illness. Definition is found in Chapter 135C of the Code of Iowa.

Live Birth: A birth that shows any sign of life after delivery. The World Health Organization considers a sign of life as being the breathing or showing of any other evidence of life, such as beating of the heart, pulsation of the umbilical cord, or definite movement of voluntary muscles, whether or not the umbilical cord has been cut or the placenta is attached. The responsibility for determining if a birth meets this definition is that of the attending physician.

Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA): An area with one city of 50,000 or more inhabitants or a Census defined urbanized area and a total metropolitan population of at least 100,000 (75,000 in New England).

Neonatal Death: Death of a liveborn infant occurring within the first 27 days of life.

Nursing Facilities: Institutions or distinct parts of institutions housing three or more individuals for a period exceeding 24 consecutive hours, whose primary purpose is to provide health-related care and services, including rehabilitation, for individuals who because of mental or physical condition, require nursing care and other services in addition to room and board. Nursing facilities do not engage primarily in providing treatment or care for mental illness or mental retardation. Definition is found in Chapter 135C of the Code of Iowa.

Perinatal Death: Death of a fetus of greater than 20 weeks gestation or death of a liveborn infant under 28 days of life.

Primary Care Physicians: Includes Family Practice, Internal Medicine, Pediatric, and Obstetrics/Gynecology physicians.

Public Access Defibrillation: An EMS provider level for nontraditional providers of emergency medical care who have successfully completed a program that uses a curriculum that meets the approved Iowa objectives regarding Public Access Defibrillation and have successfully completed the department's testing requirements.

Residential Care Facilities: Institutions, places, buildings, or agencies providing accommodation, board, personal assistance and other essential daily living activities for a period exceeding 24 consecutive hours. Individuals living in a residential care facility are unable to sufficiently or properly care for themselves because of illness, disease, or physical or mental infirmity, but do not require the services of a registered or licensed practical nurse, except for emergencies. Definition is found in Chapter 135C of the Code of Iowa.

Residential Care and Specialized 3-5 Bed Facilities for the Mentally Retarded: Facilities that provide accommodations, board, personal assistance, essential activities of daily living and habilitation services to three or more individuals with mental retardation. Residents of a Residential Care Facility for the Mentally Retarded are unable to sufficiently or properly care for themselves, but do not require the services of a registered or licensed practical nurse. The specialized license is for Residential Care Facilities which serve persons with mental retardation, chronic mental illness and other developmental disabilities having five or fewer residents as specified in Iowa Code Section 225C.26. The facility is exempt from Iowa Code Section 135.63. Definition is found in Chapter 135C of the Code of Iowa.

Regional Trauma Care Facility: Provides comprehensive care for the severely injured patient with complex multisystem trauma. An organized trauma team including a general surgeon, emergency physician, anesthesiologist, nursing and ancillary personnel are immediately available to the patient upon arrival at the emergency department. The general surgeon and anesthesiologist are immediately available to the patient upon arrival at the emergency department. The general surgeon and anesthesiologist may take call from outside the hospital, but with a clear commitment to meet the patient upon arrival at the emergency department. A broad range of physician specialists are on-call and promptly available to provide care and/or consultation. In addition to direct patient care, regional trauma care facilities are responsible for community and outreach education and injury prevention.

Resource Trauma Care Facility: Provides the most comprehensive care for the severely injured patient with complex multisystem trauma. An organized trauma team including a general surgeon, emergency physician, anesthesiologist, nursing and ancillary personnel are immediately available to the patient upon arrival at the emergency department. Physician specialists may also respond immediately with the trauma team. A broad range of physician specialists are on-call and promptly available to provide care and/or consultation. In addition to direct patient care, resource trauma care facilities are responsible for resident training, research, community and outreach education and injury prevention.
