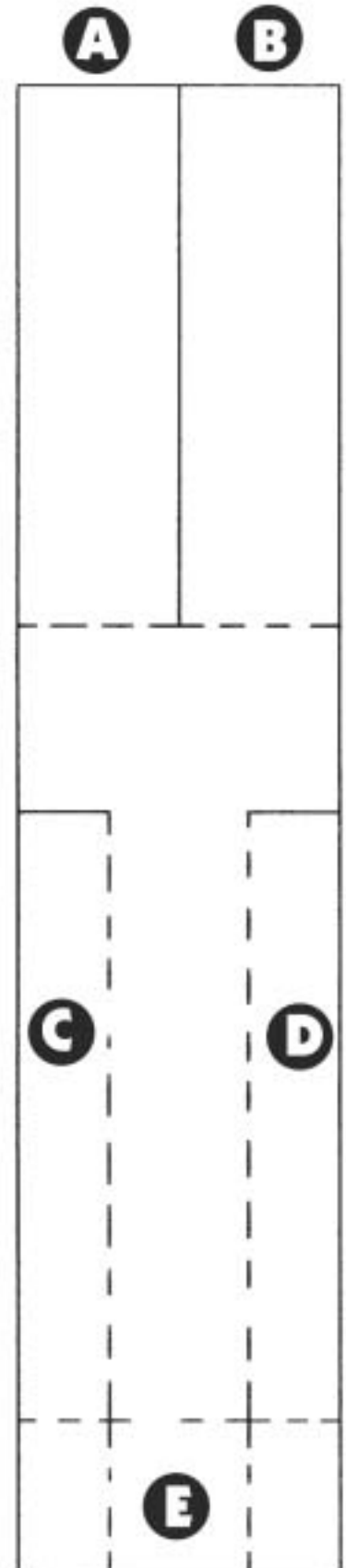
Help A. Wing Nut find the way to the hangar!

WHIRLIGIG

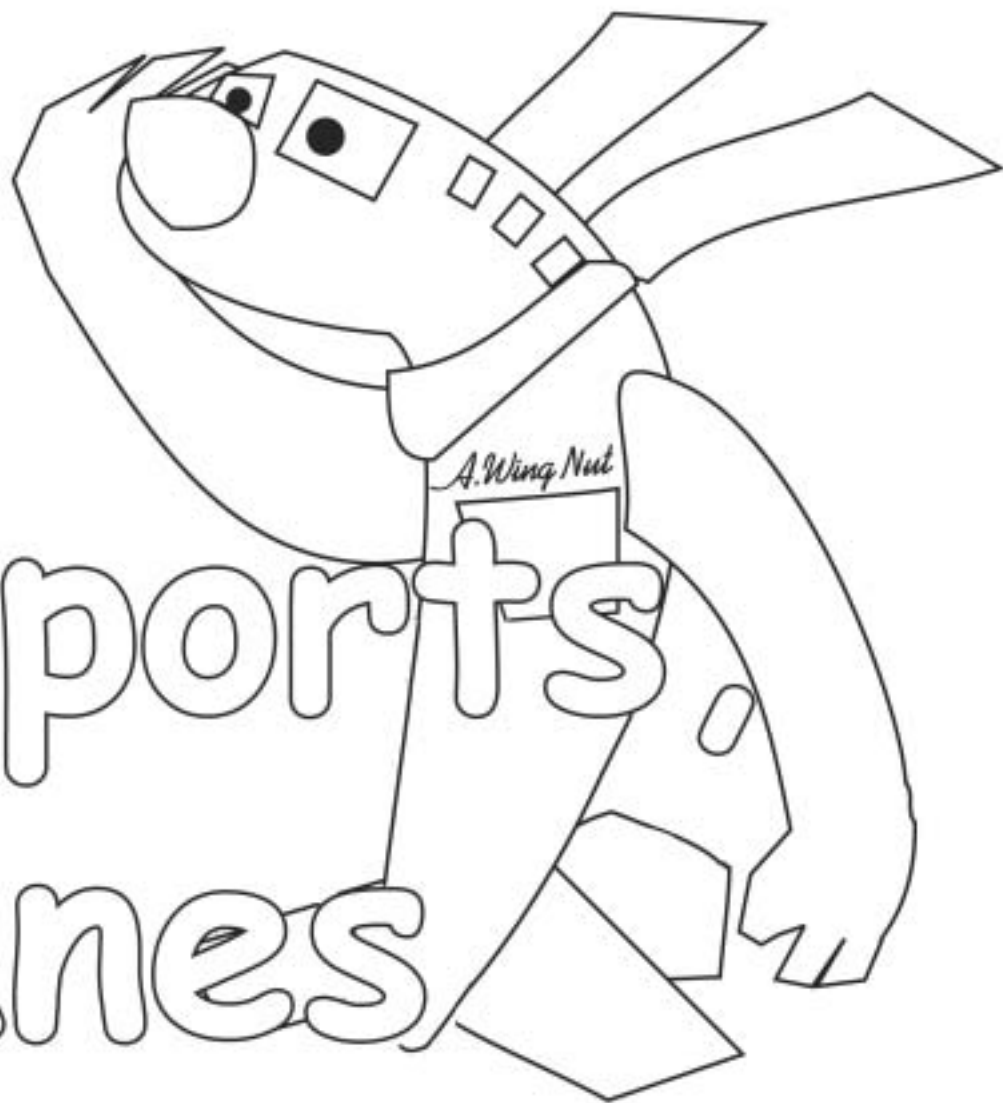


1. Cut along all the solid lines.
2. Fold along the dotted lines; flap A forward and flap B to the back.
3. Fold flaps C and D forward along the dotted lines.
4. Fold along the dotted line E upward to give a weight at the bottom.
5. Now this should look like the drawing at the top.

Drop with weighted end (E) down.



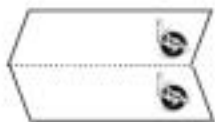

1. Fold sheet in half on dotted line.
2. Fold the short edge of one side down to the first fold. Do this for the other side too.
3. Fold down the new fold you have created to the original fold you made in step one.. Repeat for the other side.
4. Do step three again for both sides.
