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Cattle on Feed

There were 1,210,000 cattle on feed for the slaughter market in all feedlots in Iowa on July 1, 2011, down 6 percent from June 1, 2011 and down 4 percent from July 1, 2010. Feedlots with a capacity greater than 1,000 head had 590,000 head on feed, down 3 percent from last month but up 4 percent from last year. Feedlots with a capacity less than 1,000 head had 620,000 head on feed, down 8 percent from last month and down 10 percent from last year.

Placements during June totaled 114,000 head, an increase of 24 percent from last month but down 4 percent from last year. Feedlots with a capacity greater than 1,000 head placed 64,000 head, up 36 percent from last month and up 12 percent from last year. Feedlots with a capacity less than 1,000 head placed 50,000 head. This is up 11 percent from last month but down 19 percent from last year.

Marketings for June were 180,000 head, up 9 percent from last month but down 4 percent from last year. Feedlots with a capacity greater than 1,000 head marketed 80,000 head, up 10 percent from last month and up 7 percent from last year. Feedlots with a capacity less than 1,000 head marketed 100,000 head, up 9 percent from last month but down 11 percent from last year. Other disappearance totaled 9,000 head.

July 1 Cattle Inventory Down One Percent

All cattle and calves in the United States as of July 1, 2011, totaled 100.0 million head, 1 percent below the 101.1 million on July 1, 2010.

All cows and heifers that have calved, at 40.6 million, were down 1 percent from July 1, 2010.

- * Beef cows, at 31.4 million, were down 1 percent from July 1, 2010.
- * Milk cows, at 9.2 million, were up 1 percent from July 1, 2010.

Other class estimates on July 1, 2011 and the changes from July 1, 2010, are as follows:

- * All heifers 500 pounds and over, 16.0 million, down 1 percent.
- * Beef replacement heifers, 4.2 million, down 5 percent.
- * Milk replacement heifers, 4.2 million, up 4 percent.
- * Other heifers, 7.6 million, down 2 percent.
- * Steers weighing 500 pounds and over, 14.2 million, down 1 percent.
- * Bulls weighing 500 pounds and over, 2.0 million, down 5 percent.
- * Calves under 500 pounds, 27.2 million, down 1 percent.
- * All cattle and calves on feed for slaughter, 12.2 million, up 3 percent.

The 2011 calf crop is expected to be 35.5 million, down 1 percent from 2010. Calves born during the first half of the year are estimated at 25.8 million, down slightly from 2010.
