
Avenue Extension Dedication

The "Revitalize lowa's Sound Economy" (RISE) program was created by the 1985 lowa Legislature to help pay for the construction and improvement of lowa roads. But RISE is a road program with a difference. The RISE program is designed to foster economic development and, ultimately, create jobs. Funded by a percentage of the tax on motor fuel, the RISE fund will provide about \$28 million each year for road improvements. Counties and cities working to attract new development will find the RISE program one more tool to "sweeten the pot" with state assistance.
