Policy

From the WIC Program Goals Manual - 215.06 Certification Periods

By participant category

The length of a participant's certification varies with the category. The table below lists the certification period for each participant category.

Category	Length of Certification Period			
Infant	• If less than six months old at certification, may be			
	certified up to the infant's first birthday			
	• If six months or older at certification, may be			
	certified for six months			
Child*	Six months, ending with the end of the month of the			
	child's fifth birthday			
Pregnant woman*	For the duration of the pregnancy and up to six			
	weeks postpartum			
Postpartum women*	For up to six months postpartum			
Breastfeeding	12 months postpartum or earlier if she stops			
woman*	breastfeeding			

^{*}Includes children and women with qualifying conditions that require WIC formula (infant formula, exempt infant formula and WIC-eligible medical foods.

A participant who is still categorically eligible for WIC at the end of a certification period may apply for another certification period. The length of subsequent certification periods is the same as listed in the table above.
