In most instances, a notary public requires a commission and acts as an official, unbiased witness to the identity of another person. The purpose of the notary public is to prevent forgery and fraud. Like the above, a **blaster** may either be used for part-time employment or incorporated into the job duties of another occupation. A blaster is an individual who is in charge of and responsible for the loading and firing of explosive materials. The occupation requires a license. Construction Contractor Registration: Iowa Code, Chapter 91C, requires that all construction contractors working in Iowa who earn more than \$1,000 per year and who *DO NOT* work strictly on their own property, *MUST* be registered with the Division of Labor. This registration is a tracking device for the state to assure, insofar as possible, that all contractors are in compliance with the unemployment tax and worker's compensation laws of Iowa. All out-of-state contractors working in Iowa and whose contract is for \$5,000 or more must, in addition to registering, post a surety bond in the amount of five percent of the contract amount or \$1,000, whichever is greater or post a blanket bond for \$50,000 made payable to the Iowa Division of Labor. This is to assure that all fees, fines, or taxes which accrue to the State of Iowa as a result of the execution of said contract are paid prior to release of the bond.

Private Employment Agency Licensing: The Code of Iowa, Chapter 94A, requires that a person (or business) operating as an employment agency obtain a license from the Labor Commissioner prior to transacting business lest he or she be found guilty of a serious misdemeanor. Employment agency transactions include helping applicants find work or helping employers find employees *when a fee is to be paid by the applicant*. Those employment agencies located within Iowa and those outside Iowa that target Iowa applicants and/or employers must obtain a license. This, however, does not include employee leasing firms.

To become licensed, the private employment agency obtains the necessary paperwork from the Labor Services Division, properly completes and resubmits the required information back to the Division with a \$75 fee. The license must be renewed annually and runs from July 1 through June 30. To renew a license, the necessary paperwork and fee must be submitted to the Division of Labor.
