Job Description Under the supervision of a physician or physician assistant, athletic trainers provide to athletes therapy designed for prevention, physical evaluation, emergency care and physical reconditioning relating to injuries and illnesses incurred through sports-induced trauma. The trauma occurs while preparing for or participating in a sports competition or during a physical training program, either of which is sponsored by an educational institution, amateur or professional athletic group or other recognized organization.

Education & Experience Required Applicants must submit their application and fee, proof of graduation and receipt of baccalaureate degree or post-baccalaureate degree from a US regionally accredited college. Major coursework must include instruction in basic and advanced athletic training, health, human anatomy, human physiology, kinesiology and exercise physiology. Applicants must also provide proof of passing the National Athletic Trainers Association Board of Certification (NATABOC) exam.

Continuing Education Fifty hours of continuing education are required biennially for license renewal.

Examination Applicants must provide verification of passing the NATABOC Examination.

Exam: \$300 – National Athletic Trainers Association members;
\$350 – Non member
