<b>Legal Authority</b>	Code of Iowa, Chapters 147, 148 and 272: Iowa Administrative Code 653
<b>Job Description</b>	<p>Doctors of medicine perform medical examinations, diagnose illnesses, and treat people who are suffering from injury or disease. They examine patients utilizing diagnostic aids such as: stethoscope, sphygmomanometer, thermometer, and other instruments; elicit and record information about patient's medical history; order or execute various tests, analyses and x-rays to provide information on patient's condition; analyze reports and findings of tests and examination, and diagnose condition; administer or prescribe treatments and medications; promote health by advising patients concerning diet, hygiene, and methods for prevention of disease; perform surgical procedures commensurate with surgical competency; and, may practice any of the known medical and surgical specialties.</p> <p>Individuals who qualify for medical licensure in Iowa may practice medicine and surgery, call themselves "Doctor," and use the letters "MD" after their name.</p>
<b>Education &amp; Experience Required</b>	Applicants must graduate from an approved college of medicine and surgery and must complete one year of post-graduate training in an approved hospital in the U.S. or Canada. If medical education occurred at a foreign medical school, the applicant must possess a current Educational Council Foreign Medical Graduate (ECFMG) certificate.
<b>Continuing Education</b>	Forty hours of category 1 continuing medical education are required biennially for license renewal.
<b>Examination</b>	A graduate of a medical college who has never been licensed in another state must take and pass Steps 1–3 of the United States Medical Licensing Examination (USMLE). Those who have been licensed in another state must meet the exam criteria in effect in Iowa at the time of the individual's original licensure in another state.
