## Lottery To Award Big Prizes at Fair

## Motor home, Pickup to be Awarded in Aug. 22 Drawing

Iowa Lottery players can win a Winnebago motor home, Dodge Ram pickup and other prizes in a contest celebrating the Iowa State Fair's $150^{\text {th }}$ birthday.

The "Iowa State Fair $150^{\text {th }}$ Anniversary Sweepstakes" promotion will culminate with a prize drawing Aug. 22 at the Fair to determine the winners of 12 cash


A lucky Iowa Lottery player will win a Winnebago Minnie ${ }^{\oplus}$ motor home on Aug. 22. prizes of $\$ 1,500$; a Dave Lennox Signature Collection furnace installed in the winner's home; a 2004 Dodge Ram pickup; and a 2005 Winnebago 22 -foot Minnie ${ }^{\circledR}$ motor home. The final prize drawing is set for 3:30 p.m. Aug. 22 on the Bill Riley Stage at the Iowa State Fairgrounds.

The "Iowa State Fair $150^{\mathrm{h}}$ Anniversary Sweepstakes" ran June 13-July 17. Players who purchased $\$ 5$ or more (purchase on one ticket in Powerball, Hot Lotto, Iowa's $\$ 100,000$ Cash Game, Pick 3 or Pick 4) received an ottery to become qualified for entry form that they sent in to the lottery to become qualified for one of three drawings in July.

The lottery drew 15 finalists who have been invited to the Fair Aug. 22 for the final drawing. The first 12 contestants whose names are selected will each win a cash prize of $\$ 1,500$. The $13^{\text {th }}$ contestant drawn will win the home furnace; the $14^{\text {th }}$ will win the pickup and the final contestant will win the motor home.

The lottery and State Fair worked together to design a contest featuring Iowa-made and Iowa-marketed products to help highlight the sesquicentennial of one of the oldest and largest agricultural expositions in the country. 6

Did you know . . . ?
What is the legal age to play, purchase and redeem Iowa Lottery tickets?

You must be at least 21 years of age to buy lottery products in Iowa. It is legal for those under 21 to play Iowa Lottery games and claim prizes in them, if they are purchased by someone of legal age. However, a parent or guardian must also sign the ticket for any claimant who is a minor. The laws governing lottery purchases are in Iowa Code Chapter 99G, which deals with the Iowa Lottery.
Powerball Power Pack Offer Runs Aug. 8-21
Through Aug. 21, Iowa Lottery players can purchase \$3 in Powerball with $\$ 3$ in Power Play and pay only $\$ 5$. Clerks can use the new Power Pack icon on the Extrema screen and new choice on the menu of the SciScan to sell the offer. If a player purchases more than this minimum purchase, they'll still receive $\$ 1$ off their purchase. They just need to make that minimum \$3 Powerball with a \$3 Power Play to be eligible to receive the $\$ 1$ off. 6

## Winner May Designate Proxy to Fill In at Drawings



When the Iowa Lottery has a giveaway promotion event, we often receive calls from players who can't attend the event and are afraid they'll have to forfeit their prize.

## Don't Fret If You Can't Make It!

Lottery staffers will tell these players not to fret! A proxy can be appointed for any player who is eligible to attend a prize event, but can't be there in person. One example would be the live drawing at the Iowa State Fair on Aug. 22.
"They can appoint somebody to play their part," said Karen Smith, Iowa Lottery Promotions Manager.

The player may choose a proxy, or, if the player doesn't designate someone, the lottery will pick a proxy for the player.
"This should calm their fears if they can't come," Smith added.

If the player chooses to designate a proxy, they are sent a proxy form to fill out, which names the proxy and authorizes them to accept the prize. A proxy receives no monetary compensation from the lottery for their duties.

## Proxy Can Be Designated at the Last Minute

Sometimes proxies need to be designated at the last minute due to an emergency. If a player were unable to attend an event because their car broke down or because of weather, a proxy would be designated by the lottery at that time. Smith said a few non-lottery employees are chosen before an event to be on call if proxies are needed.

## Red Lobster Employees Reel In \$100,000

A western Iowa group of friends and coworkers have stuck it out through job changes and moves across the country, and last weekend hit it big playing Powerball ${ }^{\circledR}$ together.

Pat Bober, 69, of Missouri Valley and seven friends won $\$ 100,000$ in the July 10

Powerball drawing.
Bober purchased the winning ticket at Shell Speede Mart, 502
W. Erie in Missouri Valley.

Bober said she and her friends play Powerball faithfully, twice a week, just as they have for the past seven years or so. When the group started playing together, they worked at the same restaurant.
"Originally we were all [working at] Red Lobster [in Omaha]," she said. "Two have dropped out and work elsewhere now, but they stayed in the group. They figured once they dropped out we'd win."

The seven who will share the prize with Bober are Dorothy Kirton, Nicholas Henke, Arnell Petrzilka, Patricia Benke, Kathleen Kahl, Alice Castenada and Heidi Demuth. Kirton now lives in Florida, the rest of the group lives in the greater Omaha/ Council Bluffs area.
"I told my children [about winning the money]. I have nine children. I have 18 grandchildren, and I just had my seventh great-grandchild. But they're not getting any [of the prize money]!" Bober laughed.

The group is either undecided or tight-lipped about how they plan to spend their winnings.
"I don't think they've really decided what they're going to do. Maybe invest a little bit and 'party' with the rest!" Bober said.
