Mystery Millionaire Named at State Fair

retired police officer won \$1 million, two other Iowans won \$100,000 prizes and 12 more claimed prizes of \$25,000 or \$50,000 in the Iowa Lottery's "Mystery Millionaire" finale Aug. 19 at the Iowa State Fair. Thousands of fairgoers crowded in to watch and cheer during one of the biggest live giveaways in the lottery's history.

Dean Stuhr of Des Moines, who retired in April after the show's three rounds of

competition to win the top prize of \$1 million. The final round had come down to three contestants who chose fair-themed tickets on a stick to determine their prize. Stuhr's ticket revealed "\$1 million" while the other two finalists took home \$100,000 prizes.

"I would have been happy with \$100,000, really," Stuhr said after the show. "This is just overwhelming. It's just unbelievable."

When asked about plans for his winnings, Stuhr, 65, replied: "Help out family, more than anything."

"I had no clue this was going to happen," he said with a laugh. "I'm glad it did! But I had no clue."

Sheree Watson of Charles City won a \$100,000 prize, as did Thuan Duffert of Des Moines, who was represented during the show by family friend Jen Larson, also of Des Moines.

The Mystery Millionaire finale, with more than \$1.6 million in prizes, capped off a busy summer promotion that had come about because of two unclaimed jackpots. One of those big prizes - a Hot Lotto[®] jackpot won with a ticket purchased in Des Moines - generated international headlines when lawyers representing a trust turned in the winning ticket with less than two hours to go before the prize would have expired, but ultimately withdrew the claim in late January. And just before that hub-bub started, an even bigger

Action Briefs

Answers to Common Lottery Questions...

Q. How often are the balls changed in the machines for Powerball and are those balls used for any other games?



A. The balls used for the Powerball drawing are changed if they show enough wear to warrant the change. In other words, there is no set time. There are actually four sets of balls of each color (four red, four white) and the sets used for a particular drawing are randomly chosen before the drawing occurs. The balls are only used for Powerball and they are weighed and X-rayed on a periodic schedule. The balls are always locked in a vault with the drawing machines and are only used under the supervision of an independent auditor.


prize - that one a \$77 million Powerball' jackpot won in Georgia - also expired without being claimed. The money from those unclaimed jackpots goes back to the individual lotteries that sell the games in proportion to the percentage of sales that came from each state. Iowa's share was a total of about \$2 million.

With the unclaimed jackpots occurring in Hot Lotto and Powerball, the lottery designed a summer promotion to give away the money that also focused on those two games. Lottery players entered more than 197,000 tickets during the Mystery Millionaire entry period in July, then 49 winners were selected in the promotion's initial drawing on Aug. 2. Thirty-four players won \$10,000 prizes that day, while the other 15 advanced to compete in the State Fair event for prizes from \$25,000 up to \$1 million.

Eight contestants each won a \$25,000 prize during the Aug. 19 finale: Janese Hopkins of Cedar Rapids, Kandy

Play by peeling apart the five tabs located on the back of the ticket. Three symbols are printed under each tab. Check all five tab areas. If three consecutive symbols printed vertically or diagonally under any of the tabs match identically any of the winning combinations shown on the ticket front, the player wins the corresponding prize. The arrow connecting the symbols indicates a winner.

And four lottery players each won a \$50,000 prize: Betty Freilinger of Monona, Joseph Holmes of Muscatine, Kathy Kasner of Ferguson and Richard Ritze of Alburnett.

The first 1,000 fairgoers who checked in at the live finale received registration tickets to attend the giveaway, and 15 of them won prizes from \$250 to \$1,000 during the show.

And the Retailers Won Too!

The lottery retail locations that sold the winning tickets to the 15 contestants also won prizes ranging from \$500 to \$2,000, based on how their player did in the finale. Those businesses were:

Reminders For Retailers About Paying Prizes

Iowa Lottery retailers need to be familiar with the procedures for paying prizes in all types of situations. Lottery rules state that prizes may be paid to persons of any age, but there are different considerations in paying those who are under 21.

First, all tickets must be signed before they can be checked or validated.

Paying someone under age 18 - These people are minors in the eyes of the law. If the person entitled to a prize is under the age of 18, the payment of the prize may be made with cash or a check payable to the order of the minor or to a parent or legal guardian of the minor. Claim forms and tickets submitted by minors must also be signed by a parent or legal guardian of the minor.

Paying someone ages 18, 19 or 20 – These people are no longer minors but legal adults. They may claim prizes in Lottery games as long as the claimant did not actually purchase the ticket. The person cannot use the prize winnings to purchase lottery tickets.

Paying someone age 21 or over – Retail locations may pay Lottery prizes of up to \$600. Prizes larger than that must be claimed at a Lottery office.

Retailers should always remember that tickets may not be sold to persons under the age of 21.
