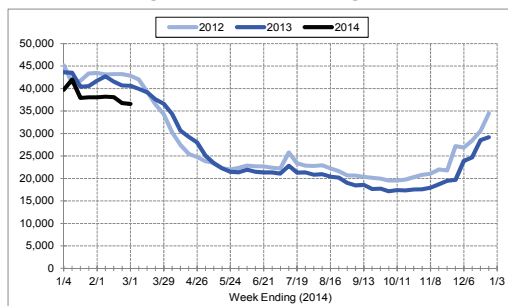
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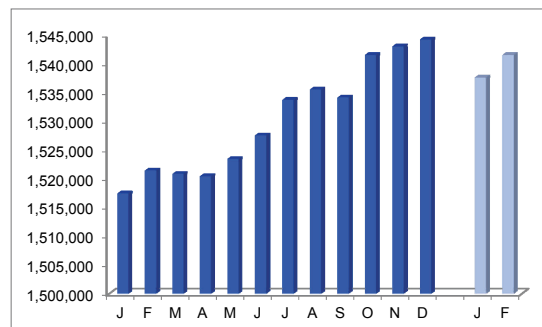
- Iowa's unemployment rate inched up to 4.4 percent in February from 4.3 percent in January, as the state's labor force increased by 6,700. The rate stood at 4.9 percent one year ago.
- The statewide labor force climbed to 1,684,500 in February, quickly closing in on the record of 1,695,100 set in January 2009.
- The U.S. unemployment rate rose to 6.7 percent in February from 6.6 percent in January. February marked the first increase in 14 months.

Continued Weeks Claimed for Unemployment Insurance (UI) Regular State UI Program



- Regular UI continued weeks claims for the first two months of 2014 have been running about 8 percent below the previous year.
- A recovery in Europe and Japan, along with a faster pace of domestic growth, should support stronger business investment in 2014. There has never been a time when businesses have had so much cash and such light debt burdens.
- Inflation is expected to remain below two percent in 2014, increasing by close to 1.8 percent for the year. General price pressures tend to lag stronger economic growth by a year or more. The Consumer Price Index increased by 1.5 percent in 2013.

Total Nonfarm Employment - Iowa 2013-2014



- Iowa's nonfarm employment increased to 1,541,500 in February, up 3,900 jobs from January. This was the fourth gain in the last five months.
- Retail trade added the most jobs in February (+1,800), rebounding from last month's sharp loss. Construction followed with a gain of 1,500 jobs.
- The state has gained 20,100 nonfarm jobs since February 2013. Education and health services led year-over-year job growth (+4,900), followed by trade and transportation (+4,100).
- Iowa's state and local governments have largely stopped shedding jobs, and are expected to begin adding to payrolls this spring. This is good news after nearly five years of job cuts that hit middle-income households the hardest.
