Extreme Programming in a Large J2EE Environment

To effectively build J2EE applications, you need more than just an ad hoc development process. Traditional methodologies work out to be too rigid and slow to work in the compressed timeframes that we see today. As a result, many organizations have been experimenting with the ideas that grew out of the C3 project at Chrysler under the name XP (Extreme Programming). Originally conceived as a set of disciplines for software development on small projects, XP has matured and grown to include ideas about project planning, tracking and delivery. The application of XP to larger Java enterprise developments has been relatively unexplored. Led by Cara Taber of Thoughtworks, this session will cover aspects of testing, paired programming, documentation, and delivery.
