Policy

From the WIC Services Policy and Procedure Manual – 330.10 Local WIC Data System Hardware, Software, and Internet Connectivity Requirements 2 of 2

All WIC main offices (includes split offices within an agency) must maintain high-speed Internet access - DSL, cable modem, or cellular (cellular hotpsot).

Satellite WIC clinics that are connected to the Internet must have high-speed Internet access. All local WIC agencies must maintain the level of Internet connectivity at satellite clinics that is currently being provided.

Local agencies must have the minimum for Internet access:

• 512 kb, 3G (cellular)

The following Internet access is recommended:

• 1.5 Mb or higher, 4G (cellular), T1

Note: The following website lists cellular hotspots that are compatible with the Cradlepoint router. Go to the website and click on "Modem & Accessory Info".

Contact the WIC Help Desk if internet service changes at any WIC clinic.

All key staff must have **individual** e-mail addresses with the capacity to send and receive electronic communications (e-mail and attachments).

All agency staff using IWIN must have the ability to use local agency e-mail to contact the WIC state office. This can be a group of individual e-mail address. Local agency staff is not allowed to e-mail the state WIC office with personal e-mail accounts from state owned computers.
