## Congressman Boswell Visits with ICN

On Tuesday, August 17, U.S. Congressman Boswell congratulated the ICN on being awarded a \$16.2 million grant from the Broadband Technology Opportunities Program.

The event included a panel discussion explaining how ICN's funding will improve broadband connectivity, which will have a significant impact on public safety across lowa.

"A reliable 21st century communications network is vital for thousands of rural communities to survive and grow," Congressman Boswell said. "I have always fought for federal investment in broadband

in lowa to support our schools, improve public safety and emergency management services, and grow our small business community. This \$16.2 million grant to the ICN will improve public safety and the discussion was valuable to understanding how these federal dollars will be used."

ICN's grant will enable lowa Emergency
Management to use advanced web-based emergency management applications and provide lowa's Department of Public Safety with reliable, statewide, high-speed connections to local law enforcement agencies and public safety access points.

program. Many educators see the process of giving each student their own laptop as a means of managing the cultural divide between different views of technology. The 1:1 program provides more opportunities for teachers and students to collaborate with other educators, students, and professionals throughout the world.

### ICN's Executive Director Search Continues

The Iowa
Telecommunications and
Technology Commission
(ITTC) continues its
search for ICN's
permanent executive
director. The ITTC has
hired the research firm
Management Resource
Group, Ltd (MRG), located
in Davenport, IA, to

perform the search for the position. There were over 100 applicants who applied, and MRG narrowed the number of qualified individuals down for a selection committee tasked to select two candidates. The selection committee includes members from multiple

backgrounds consisting of individuals from the private sector, the user community, and members of the Commission. The final two candidates will interview with the ITTC on September 2. Following those interviews, an announcement will be made.

### K-12 Connections Breaks Record

<u>K-12 Connections</u> soars to new heights breaking the previous record of video conferencing hours utilizing the ICN.

lowa Public Television's (IPTV) *K-12 Connections* had the best year recorded, generating over 9,820 video conferencing hours delivered over the ICN's fiber-optic Network during the 2009-2010 school year.

Through IPTV's free *K-12 Connections*, students explore worlds near and far, interacting live with presenters.

In addition, professional development sessions are provided for teachers and other district staff.

## Library Staff across Iowa Utilizes the ICN

Public library staff across lowa attended an informational meeting that explained revisions made to an accreditation program via the ICN on July 22.

A video session sponsored by the State Library of Iowa included over 90 of Iowa's library directors, trustees, and staff, which utilized 45 video sites in Iowa, connected by ICN's fiber-optic Network. The topic discussed was proposed changes made to "In Service to Iowa," which is the manual for the State Library's public library accreditation program.

Scott Dermont, a Library Consultant with the State Library of Iowa's said, "The benefit of using the ICN is that we can reach a great number of people. Using the ICN [video services] gives the opportunity to see and interact more freely."



## ICN Customer Survey Results

In July 2010, ICN completed its annual customer survey to evaluate the satisfaction of customers. The survey was conducted internally using SurveyMonkey. We had 190 individuals complete the survey, which provided us valuable customer feedback.

Below are results of the survey:

 Almost 88 percent stated that they were satisfied or very satisfied with the overall satisfaction of services received. This is a five (5) percent increase from last year.
 Over 82 percent indicated that the value of the ICN services was either an excellent or good value as compared with a 75 percent score last year.

 Almost 90 percent indicated that they would be very likely or somewhat likely to recommend ICN services.
