Prevalence of Nutrition Risk by Local Agency Report**

Description	This report identifies the number and percentage of participants in each participant category who were assigned specific risks at certification by a local agency.
Data updated	Monthly
Parameters	Local Agency, Federal Fiscal Year
Records reported	Each nutrition risk recorded at each certification during the fiscal year
Report columns	<p>Report columns include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Headers with total number of certifications examined for the report, total number of unique (unduplicated) participants, and local agency name • Risk • All participant types • Pregnant • Breastfeeding • Not Breastfeeding • Infant • Child • Total [All participant types]
Data sort order	Local Agency, Clinic, Frequency of risk for all participants (high to low)
Totals available	All columns for Local Agency and State Agency
Tips	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use this report in local agency needs assessment activities. • Risks are reported based on clinic assignment at the time of certification. Therefore, the report will include data for individuals who are no longer in their caseload. • Risk data is counted for each certification during the fiscal year and for both participant types if the individual was certified with different participant types each time. Examples include the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – A woman certified as pregnant and then certified as breastfeeding – An infant certified as an infant and then as a child – A woman certified as breastfeeding and then certified as not breastfeeding

- Risk data is counted for precertifications and full certifications completed for an individual during the fiscal year
- If the same risk was assigned to a given participant twice during the year, it will be counted twice.
- This report is cumulative during the fiscal year.
