The purpose of the IRRC is to apply current research to the development and dissemination of best practices in literacy instruction so that every child in Iowa will achieve reading proficiency. Included in this mission is a strong focus on facilitating effective school, parent, and community partnerships to improve student literacy.

Launched in October, 2014, the new IRRC website offers a collection of online resources for families to support literacy development with children at home. These high quality videos, articles, and activities are suitable for use with children from birth to 6th grade. All have been carefully reviewed and evaluated by both parents and educators to ensure quality and accessibility, and they can be sorted by key word, skill, age group, and resource type. Our website also includes links and information to help families connect to other literacy resources and services throughout the state and the nation.

The 2015 Kids First Conference will be held May 4-5, with a post-conference on May 6, at the Holiday Inn Airport/Conference Center, 6111 Fleur Drive, Des Moines. The general theme will be, "Youth Services Librarians: Bridges to Literacy." The conference Registration for each of the two days of the conference is \$50.00. If you register for both days,

There will be a storytelling festival (Monday evening), a maker-space/crafting room (including an altered books contest), and casual get-togethers in the evenings.
