## Lottery to Test Launch ‘Quarter Play' Game Card



The "Quarter Play" electronic game card is being test launched in eastern lowa beginning Oct. 4.

An electronic version of the traditional scratch game will make its world debut when an Iowa market test of the battery-powered product begins Oct. 4.

The new product, known as an electronic game card, will be marketed in the Cedar Rapids, Dubuque and Waterloo areas. It's called "Quarter Play," which aptly describes it-with 80 plays on a card sold for $\$ 20$, each play costs 25 cents.

Each card, about the size of a driver's license, is loaded with random plays. Three small LED screens on the front of the game card display the numbers in a particular play and show whether that play has won a prize.

Players accumulate points, each having a value of 25 cents, by getting three like numbers or any " 7 " as they advance through the 80 plays. At the conclusion of all the plays, the game card displays the total points accumulated. Each card in the market test will win at least a $\$ 5$ prize and could win up to \$300.

If the test launch is successful, the game card may be distributed statewide at a later date.

Although not all retailers will sell the game card, players will be able to redeem the card at any lottery retailer-even one that doesn't sell them. If a retailer receives an electronic game card for validation, they should use the procedure on page 3.

## Retain Cards For Recycling

Also, after validation, retailers should retain the cards and then return them to your lottery DSR so the lottery can recycle the materials.

Entry forms/ brochures and pink envelopes are located in a pocket on the "Tabs for Cash" topper distributed to pull-tab retailers. main screen, then choose "Electronic Game Card" from the menu on the screen.
3) Pull open the door on the front of the SciScan 1500 reader. You'll see a red beam inside the SciScan. Turn the card sideways, bar code facing away from you, and pass it in front of the beam (See Fig. 3). If you have a SciScan 500, like the one pictured in Fig. 4, roll the wheel on the right-hand side of the SciScan until the beam is visible through the slit in the front of the box. Pass the game card in front of the beam.
4) Enter the security code (the three numbers in the box as shown in Fig. 2) on the pop-up screen when prompted.

## On the SciScan 2000 and 3000:

1) Scratch off the latex as described in Step 1 for the Extrema.
2) Choose Manual Entry from the main screen, then choose
(3) "Electronic Game Card."
3) Open the door on the front of the SciScan and look for the red beam inside. Turn the card sideways, bar code facing away from you, and pass it in front of the beam. (See Fig. 3).

4) Enter the three-digit security code (the three numbers in the box as shown in Fig. 2) when prompted.

## Arnolds Park Woman Triple Lucky on Cash Game

A northwest Iowa woman tripled her winnings when her lucky numbers came up recently!

Marian "Tootie" Steward, 45, of Arnolds Park won the top prize in the $\$ 100,000$ Cash Game on Sept. 10. She purchased her winning ticket at Kum \& Go, Highway 71 and Sanborn in Okoboji. Steward claimed her prize at Iowa Lottery headquarters in Des Moines, accompanied by her husband Max.

Because Steward played the same numbers three times on the same ticket, when they came up as winners, she won not once but three times-for a total of $\$ 300,000$ ! Steward plays the Cash Game every day. She plays the same set of numbers, three plays on one ticket, each time she plays. The numbers she plays are birthdays (hers and her husband's included).

Just because she's a veteran player, however, doesn't mean she wasn't shocked when her numbers came up!

They were having coffee at a cafe in town when they read the winning numbers. "I freaked out," Steward laughed. "I had the ticket in my wallet which I left in my purse out in the car. I told Max, 'I'll be right back,' and I ran out and got the wallet with the ticket and we reviewed it once again with the newspaper."

Max was just as shocked as she was!
"I was white as a ghost," Steward said. "He was white, too."
"I was trying to keep her from screaming," he interjected, smiling.
