


- lowa's unemployment rate dropped slightly to 4.2 percent in January from 4.3 percent in December. The state's jobless rate was 4.4 percent one year ago.
- The state's total employment level continued to trend upward in January, reaching 1,645,000.
- The U.S. unemployment rate edged up slightly to 5.7 percent in January from 5.6 percent in December.

Regular UI Benefits by Industry January 2014 - December 2014



- The construction industry accounted for 27 percent of UI benefits paid during 2014. Manufacturing followed with 18 percent while trade comprised 10 percent. These values were on par with the previous two years.
- The consumer price index for the nation decreased by 0.7 percent in January and was the thirdconsecutive loss. The decline was heaviest in energy indexes.
- Job openings and separations have increased versus one year ago as the economy expands in activity.
- The U.S. economy added 239,000 jobs in January and is up 3.2 million jobs versus one year ago.

Total Nonfarm Employment - Iowa January 2014 - January 2015



- lowa nonfarm employment added 3,100 jobs in January, raising the monthly total to 1,562,200. The January figure was 24,800 jobs higher than one year ago.
- Trade and transportation added the most jobs in January (+2,200) and was fueled by growth in the retail sector. Professional and business services also posted a strong gain this month (+1,800).
- Construction posted a small loss this month, but was booming throughout 2014, adding the most jobs compared to last January (+6,500).


