

#### Kids First in Review - Part I

The Kids First Conference was held on May 4 & 5 at the Holiday Inn Des Moines-Airport. Most of this issue of the YAC Newsletter is dedicated to providing links and instructions for projects from the Craft Room/Maker Space at Kids First.



Winner of the **Altered Books Contest** was Barb Sowers from Readlyn. Here are a couple of sample pages from her art journal. Thanks to those who brought items to share!



#### EASY ZOO

- Fold a sheet of cardstock/stiff paper in half (either direction

   depending on the height you want)
- Cut in 2 or 3 sections. Cut out a square or rectangle from the non-folded side to create legs (be a little bit creative try a

half circle or other shape for the space between the legs -

just be sure to keep the folded edge intact).

- Add a neck to hold the head a strip of paper, a short fan-folded strip, a pipe cleaner piece, etc.
- Add a head piece a circle, oval, etc. Features might be drawn on, glued on (add sequins, googly eyes, etc.) - use what you have.
- Add a tail made of yarn (drawn through a small hole), a pipe cleaner piece, etc. Again use what you have!



#### EASY DIORAMA


- Cut large circle (any size) in half. Cardstock or construction paper works well.
- Fold the half circle in half.
- Cut a small notch (1/4 to 1/2") in the fold on the straight edge.
- Draw a line from the point of the notch to the outer circle at a very slight upward angle. (Too much angle will cause your diorama to lean too much!) Press hard to create a score line for folding.




- Fold the "tabs" that you have made back. These will be glued or taped to a base sheet of paper.
- Decorate your diorama before attaching to a base. You may add additional circles in different sizes for a 3-D effect.



1) Start with half circle



2) Fold in half and make small notch



3) Score a line from the point of the notch to the outside of the circle. Fold along the score lines to create tabs.

SIDEWALK PAINT

- Mix equal amounts of cornstarch and water.
- Add food coloring a little at a time. Or use unsweetened powdered drink mix for color and scent!
- Washes off easily and is safe for painting trees, sidewalks, and feet.

# **Button Books**

Of course, you could use real buttons, but this version gives kids a bit larger size to work with.

•Start with circles cut from stiff paper or cardboard. •Fan-fold a strip of regular paper that is narrower than the diameter of the circle. For example, use

1 ½" strips with 2" circles. •Punch holes in the "covers" and draw the inner

circle to look like a button.

•Attach each end of your folded strip to the button cover.
