**1) EBSCO Classes In-Person In April:** Iowa Library Services is sponsoring **EBSCOHost** training in April. These classes are coming to Northwest and North Central Iowa this time, having been offered in the other Districts last summer and fall. The instructor will be Lisa Dennis, a national trainer for the EBSCO corporation.

**EBSCOHost** is available to all Iowa public libraries for a small yearly fee. It contains literally thousands of magazines and journals on a variety of topics, many of the articles are full-text. This important training session will provide instruction in searching

**EBSCOhost** more effectively, as well as marketing the product to your patrons.

- National Women's History Month

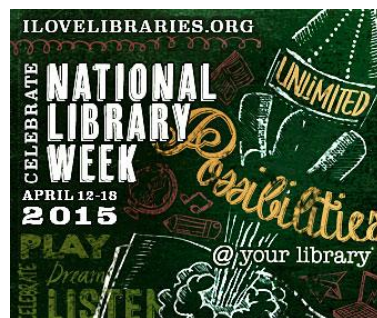
Look at March a day-at-a-time:
