

2) Enrich Iowa Reports Due July 31: In April, all lowa libraries were asked to renew their intention to participate in Enrich Iowa. That was done by completing a super easy form called the Enrich Iowa Letter of Agreement and checking all 3 boxes—Open Access, ILL Reimbursement, and Direct State Aid. So renewed participation comes first, reporting your library's activity in these programs comes next.

By **July 31** each year, all lowa libraries are required to report their level of activity in these same programs. For **Open Access**, report the



number of checkouts your library made to *Open Access* patrons—those people visiting your library from other participating *OA* libraries in Iowa—and <u>checking out physical items</u>. Downloading eBooks or using other digital products does not count as *Open Access* checkouts. For *ILL Reimbursement*, we need to know the number of books your library <u>loaned</u> through SILO. <u>Lending</u> libraries are reimbursed in this program to compensate for postage costs. Tracking loans made through SILO or OCLC is easy because their software tracks it for you. lowa Library Services can look this data up, so we can save you the time of reporting those transactions. The exception is if your library loaned materials to other lowa libraries through other means. If that's true for you, then you need to report those numbers on a log and submit it to us. Finally for *Direct State Aid*, simply report how you spent the money! *Direct State Aid* is the money awarded to lowa libraries for meeting standards. The standards are fully described in the booklet <u>In Service to Iowa</u> (c2010) Under broad categories, the *Direct State Aid* report asks you to describe how this funding was used in FY15. Simply indicate the amount spent in categories such as *Materials & Supplies / Technology & Equipment / Programming / Furniture /* etc. This report form also asks for stories about the impact of this funding on your library operation. The stories you tell us become the stories we tell legislators every year when seeking increased funding for **Enrich Iowa**. 3) Clear Lake Storytelling Festival: The 2015 lowa Storytelling Festival takes place the weekend of July 24-25 in Clear Lake. This year's festival features three performers: Janice Del Negro of Brookfield (IL) Jeff Doyle of Brighton (MI) and Maureen Korte of Des Moines. They begin on Friday July 24 at 9:00PM with stories on the "Ghost Boat" aboard the Lady of the Lake paddlewheel boat. This event is intended for ages ten through adult; children under age 17 must be accompanied by an adult. Tickets for the "Ghost Boat" are \$15.00 and non-refundable; advance purchase is recommended. In case of threatening weather the ghost stories will be presented at

the Lakeview Room behind Clear Lake City Park's band shell.

The stories continue on **Saturday July 25** in the Story Tent in Clear Lake City Park. "Stories for Kids of All Ages" at 10:30AM and "Teller's Choice" at 2:00PM. All Saturday storytelling activities are free. Other visiting storytellers will also be performing at the "Story Exchange" at noon. The rain location will be the Lakeview Room.

4) Spirit of '45 Commemoration Week: The week of August 16-23 is designated as the "Spirit of '45 Commemoration Week" in Iowa. Governor Brandstad recently signed a proclamation and encourages Iowa communities to participate. This is also a good opportunity for library programming because this week honors WWII veterans.

An opening **Spirit of '45** ceremony is scheduled for Sunday August 16, 1:00PM at the Iowa Veterans Cemetery. Governor Branstad and WWII fight pilot Capt. Jerry Yellin of Fairfield, will both give remarks. The public is invited to attend. This marks one of many such ceremonies expected to take place around the country that day, including at Arlington National Cemetery, all U.S. Parks, all American Battlefield Monument Commission sites, and all cemeteries operated by the U.S. Dept. of Veteran Affairs.

Monday August 17 is the annual Iowa State Fair Veterans Day parade, where Spirit of '45 ceremonies continue. Parade grand marshals this year will be WWII veterans. The Iowa State Fair Veterans Day parade is a long-standing fair tradition. Many are Iowan vets, many come from across the country and around the world.
