On July 26, 1990, President George H.W. Bush signed into law the Americans with Disabilities Act, guaranteeing equal opportunity for people with disabilities in public accommodations, commercial facilities, employment, transportation, state and local government services and telecommunications.

The number of people in Iowa in 2014 who have some kind of disability. They represent 11.5% of the civilian, noninstitutionalized population.

31.8%

Percentage of people 65 and older in 2014 with a disability, the highest of any age group.

27,138

Number of children under 18 in 2014 who have disabilities. This amounts to 5.1% of the population under 18 years of age.

176,576

The number of people aged 18-64 with a disability in 2014 or 9.4% of the population aged 18-64.

6.7%

The percent of population in 2014 with a disability in Iowa that was Hispanic or Latino.

11.8%

The percent of males in Iowa in 2014 with a disability. This compares to 11.3% of females.

40.3%

The percent of households receiving food stamps which have one or more persons with a disability in 2014.

34.9%

Percentage of above grandparents with a disability who are responsible for grandchildren.

The number of households receiving food stamps which have one or more persons with a disability in 2014. This 40.3% of all households receiving food stamps in lowa.

Number of Iowa grandparents with a disability living with grandchildren under 18 in 2014.



Specific Disabilities

111,866

The number of lowans in 2014 reporting an inability to hear conversations or a serious hearing loss.

5.8%

Percentage of population age 5 and over with an ambulatory disability in 2014.

57,089

The number of lowans age 5 and over in 2014 who reported that a disability made it difficult to perform self-care activities such as dressing, bathing, or getting around inside the home.

108,425

The number of noninstitutionalized lowans age 18 and over in 2014 who reported an independent living disability that made it difficult to go outside the home alone to shop or visit a doctor's office.

51,659

The number of lowans of any age in 2013 who reported a disability of blindness or serious difficulty seeing even when wearing contacts or glasses.

124,817

Number of people with limitations in cognitive functioning or who have a mental or emotional illness that interferes with daily activities, including those with Alzheimer's disease and intellectual disabilities. This group comprises 4.4% of the population 5 and older. This included people with one or more problems that interfere with daily activities, such as frequently being depressed or anxious, trouble getting along with others, trouble concentrating and trouble coping with stress.

Number of Iowa veterans in 2014 with a disability representing 27.2% of Iowa veterans.

33.2%

The percent of the veteran population 18 to 64 years of age below the poverty level who have a disability.


