Iowa Community College Fiscal Year 2005 High School Enrollment Report

Community Colleges of Iowa transmit fiscal year enrollment data to the Department of Education. All data included in this report, except where noted, are taken from the Management Information System (MIS) electronic data files and are confirmed by the community college.

Fiscal Year 2005 High School Enrollment at Iowa Community Colleges

During Fiscal 2005 credit headcount enrollment included 22,905 high school students taking courses for postsecondary credit. Each community college's share of the total statewide high school enrollment ranges from a low of 1.96% at Southeastern Community College to a high of 26.51% at Des Moines Area Community College. High school students earned 163,051.75 credit hours during Fiscal Year 2005. High school students earned an average of 7.12 credits, this compares with a 14.82 average for all community college students. See Table 1.

High School Enrollment vs. Total Enrollment

High school enrollment comprises 19.05 percent of the total community college enrollment in fiscal year 2005. This ranges from a low of 7.46 percent of the student population at Kirkwood to a high of 37.59 percent at Iowa Central.

High school students enrolled in only 9.15 percent of the total credit hours provided by the Community Colleges of Iowa. This ranges from a low of 3.02 percent at Kirkwood to 20.27% at Iowa Central.

High school students (7.12 credits) take approximately half the average credit hour compared with the total student population (14.82 credits). See Table 2 for detail.


High School Enrollment by Program Type

Figure 1 – High School Enrollment by Program Type by Iowa Community College, Fall 2005



Ethnicity of High School Enrollees: As shown in Table 4 below, minority enrollments at Iowa's Community Colleges comprise 7.37 percent of the total enrollees that reported ethnicity; this compares with 9.68 percent of the overall student population. According to the 2000 census 7.4 percent of the general population in Iowa was a member of a minority racial/ethnic group.


High School Enrollment Trends:


Figure 3 - High School Enrollment as a Proportion of Total Enrollment Fiscal Year 2002 to Fiscal Year 2005

Since the Department of Education began tracking high school students enrolled for post secondary credit at Iowa Community Colleges in 2002 the growth has been significant. As shown in Table 5 below, high school enrollments at Iowa's Community Colleges have grown 46.52 percent over the past four fiscal years. High school students made up a larger proportion of the total student population in 2005 (19.05%) than in 2002 (14.79%). See Figure 3.



Northeast Iowa Community College High School vs Regular Enrollment Fiscal Years 2002-2005





Northeast Iowa Community College High School Enrollment by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2005






Iowa Lakes Community College High School vs Regular Enrollment Fiscal Years 2002-2005



Iowa Lakes Community College High School Enrollment by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2005






Northwest Community College High School Enrollment by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2005



Iowa Central Community College High School vs Regular Enrollment





Iowa Central Community College High School Enrollment by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2005






Iowa Valley Community College District High School Enrollment by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2005



Hawkeye Community College High School vs Regular Enrollment Fiscal Years 2002-2005







Kirkwood Community College High School vs Regular Enrollment Fiscal Years 2002-2005



Kirkwood Community College High School Enrollment by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2005






Western Iowa Tech Community College High School vs Regular Enrollment Fiscal Years 2002-2005






Iowa Western Community College High School Enrollment by Program Type, Fiscal Year 2005







Indian Hills Community College High School vs Regular Enrollment Fiscal Years 2002-2005




