World War II Memorial Monument Update by Michael Hines, Staff Assistant

Veterans from all branches have walked through the doors of The Iowa Veterans Home. Veterans of the Civil War, Spanish-American, World War I, World War II, Korean, Vietnam, Gulf, and peacetime have called the Iowa Soldiers Home or IVH "home". Our past and present male and female WWII veterans have served with honor. American's have always stepped up to honor, remember and pay respect for those who have served and have paid the ultimate sacrifice in order for us to have the freedom that we have today.

It is my pleasure to update everyone, especially our WWII Veterans, that our funding campaign goal of \$20,000 has been reached! Even though the campaign drive will continue to be open for donations we are extremely pleased not only with the community's effort, but the support that we have received throughout the state of Iowa. With the funding currently received, we will be able to move forward with the next phase of the project, to include the purchase of the granite, final design process, selection of a contractor and finally the foundation and installation of the monument. We have conducted 2 group meetings with WWII residents to discuss the design and what it should represent. Both meetings have gone extremely well and input has been well received and taken into consideration on what their memorial monument should represent. The Commandants Office will continue to keep the Veterans and staff informed on the phases of the monument. We would like to thank the staff for their assistance in ensuring our Veterans had the opportunity to participate in these meetings. All veterans that have attended have been very vocal in this effort. Thank-you for your service!!

Changes to CMS 5 Star Rating

There has been much press about the changes to the Five-Star Quality Rating System that became effective February 20, 2015. The changes announced will impact how CMS assigns stars for both the Staffing and Quality Measure components reported on their Nursing Home Compare website. Changes include:

- Antipsychotic medication use has been added into the five-star ratings
- How 3 and 4 Star ratings are determined on the Staffing component has changed
- Star level cut points have been rescaled in the quality measure component

Many nursing homes have seen an immediate loss of one or two stars on their Quality Measure component. Because the quality measure contributes to the Overall Star rating there are a significant number of nursing homes who have seen a Star loss in their Overall rating.

The CMS changes resulted in an immediate decrease of 2 stars in our Quality Measures and 1 star in our Overall Quality ratings (table reflects new ratings):


Starting in May we will be having a

The \$36 million renovation of the Dack and Malloy Buildings is continuing with Phase II of the three-phase project nearly complete. Malloy 2 South had the final round of punch list items reviewed and is ready for final cleaning. Furniture and room equipment will be set in place in April. Malloy 3 South is undergoing corridor handrail installation and final painting. Malloy 4 South is seeing the installation of doors, flooring and cabinets and plumbing fixtures. This project will allow us to move more residents into private rooms with a private bath. Malloy completion is scheduled for May 20, 2015. We are committed as an organization to providing our residents with a clean, safe and comfortable environment that optimizes resident independence, privacy, and dignity and are looking forward to moving residents into the Malloy South Tower. Renovation work on the Dack Building will start this summer.

Canteen Update by Susan Wilkinson, RN, Clinical Support Services Division Administrator

I hope you have all had an opportunity to visit the newly remodeled Canteen. I know there has been some speculation about how the remodel was paid for and why prices had to be raised so I hope to answer most of the questions in this article.

First, I tried to discover how long the Canteen has been in existence and the best answer I could find was "a long time." We did uncover a picture of the Canteen in a newsletter dated in the 1960's. It shows the Canteen in a basement; most likely in the Sheeler building. The recent remodel was done with memorial money that was donated by the Charles Troester estate. There is a plaque in the Canteen that commemorates this. We did not use any dollars from IVH operations budget to complete this; although our own IVH Facilities staff completed the majority of the work.

The Canteen operations budget is separate from the IVH budget. Staff positions within the Canteen include 1 Canteen Operator, 3 permanent part time canteen clerks and 6 temporary canteen clerks. The Canteen does not generate enough income to cover its' costs but because it is also viewed as a service to our residents, IVH has subsidized the Canteen to ensure its' continuing operation. (It is also a valuable service to our staff but we would not be able to provide a subsidy generated by tax dollars for staff alone.) With increasing food and personnel costs, the subsidy has been rising rapidly. It is this rising cost that prompted us to form a workgroup to look at prices, hours, items offered, staffing, etc. When looking at prices, we used a general benchmark of 30% above cost. This is the same general percentage that other entities such as convenience stores use. However, we also considered the item and what we thought it would reasonably sell for. Sometimes we knew that a 30% above cost amount would make the item too expensive so we used a smaller percentage. This calculation did result in the prices of many items going up but we are still a long way from reducing the subsidy to an acceptable level.

We are committed to keeping our canteen operational and we continue to look for ways to cut expenses and increase revenue. We intend to do this without reducing the number of hours that the canteen is open, without reducing service and without reducing the selection of items available. In fact, we have seen new items added such as the breakfast burrito, yogurt parfaits and fresh fruit and vegetables. Soon we will be adding a coffee bar as well. You can

If you have suggestions or comments about the canteen, we would love to hear them. Please get those to me and I will take them to our work group.

help this initiative by visiting often and buying your favorite items.

World War II Monument Project Making Progress!!
