***Who pays \$134 in 2017?**

- Those enrolled in Medicare Part B but not collecting Social Security or Railroad benefits in 2015.
- Those enrolled in Part B for the first time in 2017.
- Those directly billed for their Part B premium.

***What does everyone else pay?**

- The Part B premium will increase by the amount your Social Security benefit increases up to \$134. Premiums can range from \$104.90 to \$134.
- Beneficiaries with higher incomes also pay a higher premium (see chart above).
