

The Iowa Society For The Preservation Of Historic Landmarks

The Iowa Society for the Preservation of Historic Landmarks -- an organization concerned with the future of buildings and natural sites which tell the story of Iowa -- invites your participation and support.

Founded at a meeting in the Governor's Mansion in Des Moines in 1956, the Society was incorporated in 1959. It is an institutional member of the Society of Architectural Historians, the National Trust for Historic Preservation, and the American Association for State and Local History.

The purpose of the Iowa Landmarks Society is to stimulate and maintain the steadily growing interest in the identification and preservation of historic sites and buildings in Iowa, and to encourage and advise those who wish to preserve specific landmarks. The Society does not own or administer property or sites, but works cooperatively with local, state and national organizations in support of historic preservation.

The Society's activities include:

- A Spring meeting in March, the annual Fall meeting in October, and landmarks field studies or tours of historic sites during the summer.
- Publications, including an illustrated Newsletter, issued periodically to keep members informed about preservation activities, and a history of the Society, The First Ten Years. Other publications are in preparation.
- Assistance to local groups in stressing the importance of preservation. Color slide programs on historic landmarks in Iowa are available.
- Recommending specialists from the Society membership to provide programs for meetings concerned with local preservation projects or lowa's historic landmarks.
