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FOREWORD

Responding to requests for information pursuant to commercial and industrial activity in Iowa and opportunities for further development, the Governor referred this subject to the State Planning Board.

In outlining a program of study that would be of most immediate value, the Business Research Committee sought the advice and suggestions of the Greater Iowa Commission, Chambers of Commerce, and certain business leaders. As a result of these conferences a four-phase program was undertaken. It includes the following:

1. A comparative study of corporate tax structures in Iowa and neighboring states.
2. An analysis of Iowa's incorporation statutes.
3. A compilation and analysis of available social and economic data for Iowa.
4. A study of the freight rate structure in Iowa.

The subject of corporate taxes was treated in a publication titled A Comparative Study of Corporate Taxes in which state taxes payable by corporate business organizations in Iowa and ten other states were analyzed. A report titled Comparison of Incorporation Laws presented a detailed analysis of the provisions of the present incorporation statutes and those of a bill, now pending in the Legislature, covering the subject of corporations for pecuniary profit. The present publication is the first in a series of statistical reports dealing with social and economic data.

It was the consensus of opinion of those with whom this subject was discussed that no new information should be solicited by this Committee, but rather that data available from government and private sources should be brought together, selected, analyzed, and made available to organizations and individuals throughout the state. Accordingly the State Planning Board designed and sponsored a Works Progress Administration statistical project for that purpose. The information covered in the project includes such subjects as wholesale and retail distribution, manufacturing activity, taxes levied, public indebtedness, characteristics and distribution of population, employment, and education.

This report relates to the operation of wholesale and retail establishments in 1929 and 1935; the operation of service establishments and places of amusement in 1935; and carloading statistics for 1936. From basic data published by the U. S. Bureau of the Census, calculations have been made which reveal net changes from 1929 to 1935, per capita sales, percentage of state sales, and the rank of cities and counties in dollar volume of sales. Reports on other subjects will be published from time to time.

WHOLESALE DISTRIBUTION

The term "Wholesale distribution" is confined to the operations of wholesale establishments. It does not include wholesale sales made by manufacturers directly from their plants, but does include those made from separate sales establishments of manufacturers, such as sales branches and offices especially maintained for that purpose; nor does the term include wholesale sales by farmers, or by operators of mines, quarries, or oil wells, except from establishments maintained primarily for marketing purposes.

The following three tables present statistics on wholesale trade in Iowa. Table 1 breaks the total 1935 wholesale trade of Iowa into "kind of business" and the classification of the distributor. Tables 2 and 3 present wholesale trade tables for the years 1929 and 1935 and show the net percentage change between the two years--Table 2 by counties and Table 3 by cities of greater than 5,000 population.

RETAIL DISTRIBUTION

Retail distribution, as covered in these data, is the process of purveying goods to ultimate consumers for consumption or utilization, together with services incidental to the sale of goods. The distinguishing characteristic of a retailer is that the business is done in a retail manner, in a place of business open to the general public.

The principal classifications, although usually related broadly to the kind of merchandise carried, are not interchangeable with commodity classifications. For instance, grocery store sales are not exclusively sales of groceries; apparel stores sell accessories and shoes in addition to outer apparel; drug stores sell many lines other than drugs. Stores are classified according to their principal commodities or according to their popular designation. Dual-line stores, which would fall into more than one classification, are classified according to the kind of business which is the more important in terms of sales.

Food stores include 11 classifications, as follows:

Candy and confectionery stores	Grocery stores (without meats)
Dairy products stores (including milk dealers)	Combination stores (groceries and meats)
Egg and poultry dealers	Meat markets
Delicatessen stores	Fish markets - seafood
Fruit stores and vegetable markets	Bakeries and caterers
	Other food stores

Eating and drinking places consist of restaurants, cafeterias, lunch rooms, lunch counters, refreshment stands and drinking places. The sales of the latter frequently include meals. Beer for consumption on the premises, is often sold in restaurants and other eating places as well as in those places classified as drinking places.

General stores (also called country general stores) are general merchandise stores which also sell a substantial proportion of foods. They are located typically but not exclusively in the smaller communities.

General merchandise group consists of department stores, variety (Five and Ten and limited price) stores, drygoods stores and general merchandise stores. The latter are stores selling a general line of merchandise in which food, if any, is a negligible item. General merchandise stores selling a substantial quantity of food are classified as general stores, regardless of where located. General merchandise stores exceeding \$100,000 in annual sales are classified as department stores. The distinction between department stores and drygoods stores is that department stores sell a greater variety of merchandise than merely drygoods and women's apparel, usually including furniture or other household lines and men's lines, whereas drygoods stores appeal primarily or exclusively to women customers. A drygoods store becomes a department store if, and when, it adds furniture, household appliances, hardware, and/or men's clothing and furnishings, provided its total sales exceed \$100,000. If its sales are less than \$100,000 per year it becomes a general merchandise store.

Apparel group includes the following classifications:

Men's furnishings stores	Furriers and fur shops
Men's clothing and furnishings stores	Millinery stores (including leased millinery departments)
Family clothing stores (men's, women's and children's)	Custom tailors
Woman's ready-to-wear specialty stores	Accessories and other apparel stores Shoe stores

The classification "accessories and other apparel stores" includes corsets and lingerie shops, hosiery shops, children's specialty shops, infants' wear shops, and mail-order houses engaged exclusively in the sales of apparel.

Automotive group (except filling stations) includes motor vehicle dealers, used car dealers, automobile accessories, tire and battery stores, repair garages, and other automotive retailers, including those selling airplanes and parts, boats (motor boats, yachts and canoes) and trailers.

Filling stations are retailers primarily of gasoline and oil for the operation of motor vehicles. While gasoline and oil constitute their principal commodities, they may sell also such related commodities as tires, batteries and automotive accessories, and may operate lunch counters and tourist camps. Retailers exclusively of fuel oil for domestic household consumption are not included, but are classified as fuel dealers and included with "Other Stores."

Furniture - Household - Radio group consists of 5 classifications as follows:

Furniture stores	Household appliances and radio stores
Floor coverings, drapery, curtain and upholstery stores.	Radio dealers (not selling household appliances)
Other home furnishings stores	

Radio dealers are those principally engaged in the sale and care of radios, who do not also sell household appliances. Radio repair shops whose principal revenue is derived from service rather than sales are shown in the "Service Establishments."

The classification "Other Home Furnishings Stores" includes aluminum ware, the brush canvassors, antique dealers, lamp shops, etcetera.

Lumber - Building - Hardware group contains 6 classifications:

Lumber and building material dealers	Heating and plumbing equipment dealers
Hardware stores	Paints, glass, wallpaper stores
Hardware and farm implement dealers	Electrical supply stores

In using any of these classifications for market analysis it should be taken into consideration that it is extremely difficult to draw a line between wholesalers and retailers, particularly in the hardware field. If a dealer reports that he does more than 50 percent of his business at wholesale he is classified as a wholesaler. Likewise, dealers doing some but not 50 percent of their business at wholesale appear as retailers. In this particular field it is essential that both Wholesale and Retail data be taken into consideration.

Drug stores include those with and without fountains as well as leased drug departments in other stores, and direct-mail retailers of drug items.

Other stores group in addition to including beer and liquor stores (packaged alcoholic beverages) combines the following classifications:

Bicycle shops	Farm and garden supply stores

SERVICE ESTABLISHMENTS are classified into 4 major groups:

Personal service establishments, such as barber shops, beauty parlors, photographic studios, etcetera.

Business service establishments, such as billboard advertising businesses, dental laboratories, employment agencies, sign painting shops, and other establishments rendering a service to business.

Repair service and custom industries, which are subdivided into three groups: (1) Automotive repairs and service (excluding general repair garages which are included in the Retail data) such as automotive paint shops, automobile top and body repair shops, battery and ignition repair shops, tire repair shops, and automobile laundries; (2) Other repair services, such as blacksmith shops, radio repair shops, and watch, clock and jewelry repair shops; (3) Custom industries such as cabinet-making shops, grist mills, printing and publishing shops, and other custom industries, and small manufacturing establishments.

Miscellaneous service classification includes commercial mounting and finishing establishments, typewriter rental shops, livery stables and other establishments which could not properly be classified in any of the three above-mentioned groups.

PLACES OF AMUSEMENT as used in census reports are establishments primarily engaged in providing amusement or recreational facilities. Only establishments charging admission or receiving fees for use of recreational facilities are included.

* * * * *

The tabular data which follow relate to retail trade, and the operation of service establishments and places of amusement. In Tables 4 to 28, basic statistical data on retail trade in 1929 and 1935, net change between 1929 and 1935, and per capita sales are presented. (Per capita figures for both 1929 and 1935 are computed using 1930 population.) Tables 29 to 31 show the operations of service establishments; first, by kinds of service for the state, and then totals for counties and cities. Table 32 summarizes data for places of amusement.


