


- lowa's unemployment rate decreased to 3.2 percent in September. The state's jobless rate was 3.6 percent one year ago.
- The number of employed lowans increased to 1,632,300 in September from 1,627,800 in August.
- The U.S. unemployment rate dropped to 4.2 percent in September from 4.4 percent in August.

UI Benefit Cost Rate Benefits Paid / Covered Wages



- The UI benefit cost rate is defined as UI benefits paid divided by UI covered wages. The benefit cost rate reached 1.90 percent during the recession in 2010. It has since declined to 0.74 percent in 2017, the lowest benefit cost rate since 2001.
- New vehicle registrations are up 1.7 percent through September. U.S. carmakers are up 0.8 percent while foreign carmakers are up 3.3 percent. This year's mark still trails those levels established in the prior three years.
- U.S. total nonfarm payroll contracted by 33,000 jobs in September. The loss was primarily due to the effects of Hurricanes Harvey and Irma.

Total Nonfarm Employment - Iowa Jan 2016 - September 2017



- Total nonfarm employment shed jobs for the first time since April (-4,000). Private services were responsible for much of the decline (-3,300).
- Education and heath care and social assistance lost a combined 4,500 jobs. Losses were nearly split between both sectors.
- Professional and business services shed 1,500 jobs with losses being concentrated in professional, scientific, and technical services (-1,200).
- Finance rebounded this month by adding 1,200 jobs and is up 4,200 jobs annually.
- Total nonfarm employment remains up 14,200 jobs versus one year ago.
