

TRY ELDERHOSTEL

Iowa 1990

Inspired by European youth hostels and folk schools, ELDERHOSTEL is planned for those who are 60 years or older, or those whose participating spouse or companion is of the qualifying age. ELDERHOSTEL is usually only a week long, so if you are ready to adventure into new learning experiences, you can sign up for a week at any one of the 27 participating colleges—or more

You can expect something fresh and different at every ELDERHOSTEL—even on campuses you have visited before. Classes usually change each year, and no campus can be compared with any other. Each has its own indelible character and charm, works within its individual budget to provide accommodations for you and draws on a unique reservoir of local resources to offer intriguing courses and

recreational activities.

At Iowa ELDERHOSTEL, you will be in the friendly company of likeminded people your own age—some with impressive degrees and some who never finished high school and have learned from experience. They will be eager as you to form new friendships, to replace stale old thoughts with informed insights and to vacation from monotony. Like you, they want to wake themselves by learning what is new and return home refreshed in spirit.

You will bring as much to ELDERHOSTEL as you will take away. Your memories, your sense of history, your experience in life will enrich classes for your fellow students, and they will share theirs with you. Enrollment is limited to about

40 persons each session to make a comfortable group.

Why not take a learning vacation this year—one that adds to your permanent enjoyment instead of simply subtracting money from your pocket? Join the fellowship and explore your potential. It is never too late—never too early—to put a new sparkle into your life!

Courses

Lack of formal education is no barrier to ELDERHOSTEL's high-quality, nocredit courses. Each course is designed to be a self-contained unit which requires no previous knowledge of the subject. There are no exams, no grades, no required homework, although professors are pleased to make suggestions for outside reading and study. At each campus, you may choose to attend one, two or all three classes during the week of exciting coursework. Among the rich variety of offerings on the many campuses throughout Iowa, you are sure to find just the right classes for you!

Intensive Studies

A number of hostelers have requested programs where they could explore a subject in greater depth than is possible in a regular ELDERHOSTEL session. In Iowa we have several intensive offerings in writing. The emphasis is in one area rather than three. Farticipants will be expected to do homework and plan to complete a project such as a story or a poem. The poetry session at The University of Iowa is your choice of one or two week long. The novel writing sesion is three weeks and the others are two weeks in length. Only for these courses is there a possible extra charge of no more than \$25 for books or supplies.

Costs

The fee for one week is gnerally \$250. The two/week sessions at The University of Iowa are \$500 (two weeks times \$250). The three-week-long novel writing session is \$750 (three weeks times \$250). The programs at Iowa Lakes Community College end a day early and the charge is only \$230. There is a \$40 per session deposit with your registration forms with the remainder due upon arrival at the campus. In a typical ELDERHOSTEL program the fee for the week includes:

Registration costs

Six nights' accommodations

All meals from Sunday evening supper through Saturday breakfast

A variety of extra-curricular activities

Single room accommodations require an extra fee and are seldom available. Those intensive programs which are two weeks or longer include the meals and lodging during the intervening weekend.

ELDERHOSTEL fees are kept as low as possible and are fairly consistent throughout the country. But because they are still beyond the means of many qualified adults, we urge you to read the section on scholarships to learn about our program for financial assistance.

Commuters

At many schools there are a few ELDERHOSTEL spaces available to local residents on commuting basis. Commuter spaces are open only to those in-

dividuals who are residents of the local area.

It has been our experience that when commuters see how others enjoy the close association and ELDERHOSTEL spirit in the dorms, they register as regular student hostelers the next season. A commuter fee of \$125 covers tuition and activities, with a deposit of \$40 per person to accompany your application for each session of ELDERHOSTEL in Iowa, and the balance of \$85 is payable at the Sunday evening orientation at the campus.

Housing and Meals

In true hosteling fashion, ELDERHOSTEL accommodations provide the necessities without frills. Sheets, blanket, pillow and towels are supplied for hostelers, who care for their own rooms and leave them clean for the next occupants. College dorms are not luxury resort hotels, nor do hostelers expect them to be.

We are sorry that we can not honor requests for private baths. Except in rare cases, most college dormitories have common bath areas for separate male and female use. Most hostelers find the arrangements sufficiently convenient and

private.

The low cost of ELDERHOSTEL is possible only because it is based on double room occupancy. Very few campuses can provide single rooms. We absolutely can not guarantee single room availability. However, if you feel that a single is a vital necessity—and should one be available— be prepared to pay an extra

charge.

Accommodations, though often spartan in accordance with the traditional student life-style, are adequate, and occasional inconveniences may have to be endured as one of the characteristics of college life. Similarly, the food served is intended to be wholesome and nutritious but not fancy nor up to gourmet standards. College and university dining halls can not make provisions for special dietary needs. We want you to be aware of this limitation in advance so that you can bring with you whatever dietary supplements you will require.

Cancellations, Transfer and Refund Policies

If you must cancel, we refund all but \$15 per week, according to national policy, provided that you notify the state office in Iowa City no later than three weeks before the starting date of your chosen program. Please remember that it takes time for mail to reach us and that your notification must be in the office before the deadline, not merely postmarked on the three-week deadline. A late cancellation, i.e., those received after the deadline (within three weeks of the start of the program), results in a forfeiture of the full deposit per person.

Sometimes a person's plans change after registration. If you wish to transfer your registration from one session to another, transfers must be made at least three weeks in advance. A transfer request received after the deadline will require

an additional deposit.

Cancelled Sessions

Occasionally an ELDERHOSTEL program will have to be cancelled. ELDERHOSTEL will notify you as far in advance as possible and make every effort to assist you in finding a suitable alternative. Of course, your entire deposit will be returned if a program in which you are enrolled is cancelled and you do not wish to attend an alternate program

If no vacancies remain in your chosen program you can either enroll in one of those programs which still has space or receive a complete refunds of your

deposit.

If you apply for a scholarship and do not receive one so that you cannot attend ELDERHOSTEL, your entire deposit will be returned to you.

Don't Be a No-Show

A small number of ELDERHOSTELers have failed to notify the ELDERHOSTEL office when medical or other unforeseen last minute circumstances made it impossible for them to attend the programs for which they had confirmed reservations. These people have come to be known as No-Shows. Don't be a No-show. Help ELDERHOSTEL, its colleges and your fellow hostelers. No matter how close to the date of the session, often a person on the wait list can make last minute plans to attend if a space is available. If you must cancel—for whatever reason—please call the ELDERHOSTEL office and let us know. We also worry about you when you don't show up. We wonder if you have had an accident along the way. Thanks!

Travel

You will be responsible for arranging your own travel to and from the campus or campuses you have selected.

Pets

Pets are not permitted on ELDERHOSTEL campuses.

Policies

The granting or denial of any application for admission to a program is within the sole discretion of ELDERHOSTEL. ELDERHOSTEL may revoke admission to a program or terminate participation if, in the opinion of ELDERHOSTEL, a participant's behavior or actions are inappropriate or disruptive.

Also, each campus will try to schedule sufficient free time for you to get acquainted with your fellow hostelers and to see some of the local area. Please do remember, however, that our primary focus is on an educational program of the highest possible quality. We will want to consider you a student, so if you want to see a particular local attraction or visit relatives or friends in the community, we ask that you make these arrangements for the time immediately preceding or following the program.

Registration Form Instruction

Registration Form: This registration form may be used by one or two individuals residing at the same address. If two of you plan to attend together but have different addresses and phone numbers, please use two separate forms. If additional forms are needed, please photocopy. Registrations can not be processed without a Social Security Number.

Address: When filling in your address, please use your two-letter state postal abbreviation. Example: Iowa IA

Program Numbers: Please be sure to include the entire program number which appears in the catolog with each program choice.

Single Programs: If you are planning to attend just one ELDERHOSTEL program, use the First Program box to list your choice. Remember to list alternate choices in the proper slots in case your first choice is filled.

Multiple Programs: If you're planning to attend more than one ELDERHOSTEL program, list your first choice and alternate choices for that week under First Program. For the second week you plan to attend, list under Second Program box, etc. You will be assigned to the highest choice program available in each box.

Rooming: We cannot guarantee single rooms at the time of registration; you can indicate a preference for single room accommodations if they are available. We will not register you if you cannot accept double room accommodations. If you plan to attend with a roommate, be sure your roommate's form accompanies yours in the same envelope.

Payment: Only checks or money orders will be accepted. Please write your Social Security Number on your check. For security reasons, checks and money orders accompanying registration forms are deposited immediately upon receipt. A deposited check is merely an indication your registration form has been received. It is not an indication of your registration status.

A \$40 deposit is required for each person for each program you plan to attend. The balance due is payable upon arrival at the college.

Traveling Companions: If you plan to travel to programs with others in addition to your spouse or roommate, please be sure their forms accompany yours in the same envelope and list their names on your form under the traveling companion space to assure you all are registered together.

Alternate Choices: A few programs are popular and fill up quickly, so choose your programs carefully and pick out alternate choices you would be willing to attend.

Scholarships

Iowa ELDERHOSTEL has helped more people through scholarships than most other states, so you can be sure we would like every prospective student to have the ELDERHOSTEL experience. This year, all of our colleges are pledged to a bigger and better scholarship program than ever before!

Scholarships are awarded to encourage you to join our fellowship and are not a reward for previous academic achievement. Recipients of scholarships are requested to send the \$40 registration fee to the state office, regardless of the size of their awards. We urge you to pass the word to your friends that scholarships can help defray their costs of attending.

If \$250 per week seems a bit beyond your budget this year, estimate the supplement you think would help out, and apply early. While you're hesitating funds may be running low and vacancies at your favorite college will be filling up.


