
Orchard Place Presents An Evening Reception

Webinar: Administration for Children and Families

The Early Childhood Self-Assessment Tool for Family Shelters, developed by the Administration for Children and Families at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), is intended to help shelter staff ensure their facilities are safe and appropriate for the development of young children. Family shelters provide essential services to the entire family - including infants, toddlers, and preschoolers during a difficult time in their lives. As you work to connect families to permanent housing, you can ensure that your shelter environment assists the physical, socio-emotional, nutritional, and intellectual development of children ages 0-5 to support these children through their experience of homelessness. Creating a safe, developmentally appropriate environment will assure that the infants,

toddlers, and preschoolers in your shelter have the best possible start to a bright future as they exit homelessness into permanent housing.

To support the use of the tool, USICH is hosting a webinar -- The Early Childhood Assessment Tool for Shelters: Success in Practice -- on **Thursday, May 21, 2:30 - 3:30 PM ET**. In addition to leaders from HHS and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), community presenters from housing and early childhood will highlight their experiences with joint implementation of the assessment tool and the benefits it has yielded for their shelters in support of the overall goal of ending homelessness among families.

Message from the Deputy Assistant Secretary Libby Doggett High-Quality Preschool so that Every Child Achieves

We are working hard at the federal level to augment and stimulate expansion of preschool at the state and local levels. In April we took a small step forward: the <u>Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions (HELP)</u> added a new competitive grant program called the Early Learning Alignment and Improvement Grants to their rewrite of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This program would provide funding for states to improve coordination, quality, and access to early education. In addition, the bill includes new specific supports for early learning in Titles II, IV, V, and X and retains the allowed use of Title I funds for preschool.

Secretary Duncan applauded the leadership of Chairman Alexander, Senator Murray and the members of the HELP Committee on this and other important aspects of the bipartisan <u>Every Child Achieves Act</u> proposal. Though there is still much to be done to make it a good law, the bill now honors the widespread bipartisan call to expand access to high-quality preschool.

NIEER has released the *State of Preschool 2014* today. State pre-K programs may have turned a corner in 2013-2014, but progress remains slow. If pre-K is to be made available to even all children under 200 percent of the poverty level within the next 20 years, state investments will have to grow at a much faster pace.
