

# Envision Iowa: The Good Life Gets Better

Acting on a vision of Iowa in which the good life becomes even better, the Iowa Legislature established three funding streams to support an initiative proposed by Governor Tom Vilsack: the development of recreational, educational, entertainment and cultural projects in Iowa. This financial assistance program, popularly known as Vision Iowa, means more major attractions, more community places to play, and better

For Iowans — now and in the future such commitment says **Iowa is serious about having fun and smart about maintaining great schools.** The program has three components: Vision Iowa, Community Attraction and Tourism (CAT), and School Infrastructure.

**Vision lowa** provides financial assistance for the development of major attractions — places with regional or national draw. This program has a pledge of \$15 million per year over the next 20 years.

**Community Attraction and Tourism** (CAT) provides financial assistance for smaller projects. Through June 2004, \$12.5 million per year is available to fund community attractions and tourism.

**School Infrastructure**, administered by the Iowa Department of Education, has \$50 million available for school infrastructure improvements.

Language from the mission of the Vision Iowa and CAT programs promises an exciting return on investment for Iowa. For example, "The board will encourage and **support creative projects that enhance the lives of Iowans** throughout the state, will encourage and **support visionary thinking** in cities and towns and counties of all sizes and in all areas, and will ... support projects that **build on Iowa's unique assets and values.**"

Governor Vilsack said, "The beauty of the Vision Iowa program is that it is able to assist projects both large and small in the state's rural and urban areas. In order to grow the state's population and increase the number of visitors who come here, we must consider the needs of each Iowa community, regardless of its size."

Some of the projects approved for funding provide a preview of **good times and family fun in Iowa.** Recent approvals include:



### **River's Edge, Sioux City**

Sioux City's \$72.7 million project on Iowa's western border — also known as the Missouri River — received \$21 million from the Vision Iowa program to fund a new 10,000-seat events center and an interpretive Lewis and Clark facility.

#### **River Renaissance on the Mississippi, Davenport**

On the opposite side of the state, Davenport's \$113 million project has three major components. The River City Corridor component includes expansion of the historic Adler Theatre, renovation of the Redstone Building, and development of a river courtyard and Rhythm City skywalk bridge. The Arts Corridor includes construction of the Figge Arts Center and development of an "arts walk." The New Economy Corridor includes construction of an ag-tech venture-capital center. Vision Iowa awarded \$20 million toward the project.

### America's River at the Port of Dubuque

This \$188 million project beside the river made famous by Mark Twain will feature a Mississippi River Discovery Center, Mississippi River national education and conference center, riverfront hotel, indoor water park, and river walk. The Port of Dubuque project has received a \$40 million grant from Vision Iowa.



### **Iowa Events Center, Des Moines**

The state will invest \$70 million in Polk County's Capital City Vision project, bolstering more than \$1.5 billion of new development in central Iowa. The award includes a \$55 million grant and a \$15 million forgivable loan to assist in the development of an Iowa Events Center. The center will include an arena, convention and meeting facilities, and a riverfront restaurant. Another \$15 million is allocated for construction of new facilities for the Science Center of Iowa, and \$5 million is earmarked to help develop an Iowa Hall of Pride, which will honor high school athletes and performers.

### **McGregor/Marquette Area Legacy Project**

Vision Iowa is funding \$5 million of this northeast Iowa project near the Mississippi River. Costing more than \$25 million, the Legacy project includes a Trail of Two Cities recreational trail, downtown beautification of three Clayton County towns, a riverfront walkway, and a destination hotel and 18-hole golf course.

As of October 2001, **\$175 million in Vision Iowa funds had been awarded** to qualifying projects. Nearly \$11 million had been awarded through the Community Attraction and Tourism program.

Supported projects have included aquatic facilities, equestrian centers, multipurpose gymnasiums, performing arts theaters, YMCA additions, and lodging and conference complexes. Awards have been granted from border to border, including many small towns and major cities. Wherever a Vision Iowa project is located, everyone benefits.

### Iowa Scores High in Information Technology Careers
