

- lowa's unemployment rate remained at 2.9 percent in January. The state's jobless rate was 3.4 percent one year ago.
- The state's unemployment level dropped to 48,300 in January from 49,300 in December.
- The U.S. unemployment rate was 4.1 percent in January for the fourth straight month.


# Regular UI Benefits by Industry January 2017 through December 2017

- Construction accounted for 33
  percent of UI benefits paid during
  2017. Manufacturing followed,
  accounting for 18 percent of benefits.
- Manufacturing's share of UI benefits decreased from 22 percent in 2016 to 18 percent in 2017.
- Production workers in lowa's construction sector averaged \$850.98 per week in wages, down from \$1,092.70 in January of last year.
- Manufacturing workers averaged \$824.88 per week, up \$37.29 versus last year.
- U.S. total nonfarm payroll added 200,000 jobs in January.

#### Iowa Total Nonfarm Employment January 2017 - January 2018



- Total nonfarm employment added 900 jobs in January and has added jobs in five straight months.
- Manufacturing gained 1,300 jobs this month. Almost all the gain was in durable goods manufacturing.
- Other services added 800 jobs this month.
  This gain follows losses in November and December.
- Retail pared the most jobs this month (-1,400) after a disappointing holiday season. This sector is down 3,400 jobs versus last year.
- Manufacturing began adding jobs in February of last year and is now up 11,000 jobs annually. Total nonfarm employment combined is up 13,800 jobs.
