
Region 16 2014-2024 Occupational Projections Summary

Region 16's occupational employment is expected to increase by 6.5% from 2014 to 2024 (or 6.5% annually). Job growth will vary across major occupational groups depending on the industry. Service-providing occupations are generally expected to outperform goods-producing occupations. This is reflected in both employment change and growth rates.

Major occupational groups expected to grow faster than the regional annual average are Community and Social Service (1.2%); Healthcare Practitioner (1.4%); Healthcare Support (1.7%); Personal Care (1.5%); Construction (1.1%); Installation, Maintenance, and Repair (1.0%); and Transportation/Material Moving (.8%). Growing less than the regional average include Management (.3%); Architecture/Engineering (.3%); Life, Physical, and Social Science (.6%); Arts, Design, Entertainment, Sports, and Media (.4%); Protective Service (.5%); Food Prep/Serving (.6%); Office/Administrative (.2%); Farming, Fishing, and Forestry (.1%); and Production (.2%) major occupational groups. Business/Financial; Computer/Mathematical; Education; Building/Grounds Cleaning and maintenance; and sales occupational groups are growing at the regional average. A detailed look of 2012-2022 major occupational trends follows.

Region 16's Occupations with the Largest Projected Job Growth, 2014-2024

Region 16's top ten occupations expected to have the largest employment growth for 2014-2024 will account for 1,370 (or 34%) of the projected 4,045 new jobs. The major occupational groups of Healthcare; Personal Care; Sales; and Transportation/Material Moving will account for 1,340 (or 80%) of the 1,670 new jobs as shown below.




Region 16's Occupations with the Largest Projected Job Decline, 2014-2024

Region 16 expects a Cooks, Fast Food and Extruding, Forming, Pressing and Compacting Machine Operators to account for an employment decline of 60 jobs for 2014-2024 as shown below.

Region 16's Fast Growing Occupations, 2014-2024

Region 16's top ten occupations expected to have the largest percentage of employment growth for 2014-2024 are primarily in the Healthcare, Personal Care; and Construction major occupational groups as shown below. In conjunction with strong growth, occupational employment levels are to be reviewed in determining the largest number of job openings.




Region 16's Fast Declining Occupations, 2014-2024

Region 16 expects Cooks, Fast Food to have the largest percentage of employment decline for 2014-2024 as shown below. Employment costs, competition, technological change and other economic factors may contribute to deteriorating industry employment. While such occupations may be considered a source for employment, careful thought should be given to training time and costs.

Region 16's Occupations with the Most Annual Openings, 2014-2024

Region 16's top ten occupations expected to have the most annual openings for 2014-2024 will account for 505 (or 27%) of the projected 1,905 openings. The major occupational groups of Management; Healthcare; Sales; Food Prep/Serving; and Transportation/Material Moving will account for 470 (or 93%) of the 505 openings as shown below.
