
# 2015 ANNUAL PROFILE **REGION 11** IOWA WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

### **Executive Summary**

As of 2014, Iowa Workforce Development's (IWD) Region 11's largest private industry was Trade, representing 16.0 percent (67,074) of the region's total covered employment of 420,116. The region's total employment increased by 2.4 percent since 2013, while the average annual wage increased by 3.3 percent to \$48,842 for all industries. The Construction industry posted the largest employment percentage increase of 15.8 percent during 2014.

IWD's Region 11 average weekly wage for all industries was \$939 for 2014. This was an increase of 3.3 percent since 2013. The highest average weekly wage for a private sector was in Wholesale Trade averaging \$1,380. Between 2013 and 2014, the Agriculture, Natural Resources, and Mining sector reported the largest percentage increase in average weekly wage of 14.2 percent.






