Executive Summary

In 2014, the **arts, entertainment and recreation** sector provided 19,341 jobs to lowans, which represented nearly 1.3 percent of all covered employment (both private and public sector). This sector reported an average, sector annual wage of \$18,136, which is just 42.6% of the average wage across all industries of the state, \$42,536.

Employment in this sector was fairly steady from 2006 through 2008, but since then has dropped precipitously. The downward trend also applied to industry wages; however, they have bounced back some in 2014. Since the 2007 peak, employment has declined 11.2 percent while the average annual wage had grown and then declined since then, but actually grew by 4.2 percent again between 2013 and 2014, breaking a three-year streak of decline.

Women hold a slight majority of the jobs in this industry, holding 51.3 percent of all jobs in the industry.

Wages are significantly lower in lowa than in the nation as a whole. lowans in this industry made just over half of the national average wage of \$34,856. lowa wages are much lower than the other states in the region too, with the exception of the Dakotas, Nebraska and Kansas.






What is Information?

The **arts**, **entertainment and recreation** sector comprises: (a) establishments that are involved in producing, promoting, or participating in live performances, events, or exhibits intended for public viewing, (b) establishments that preserve and exhibit objects and sites of historical, cultural, or educational interest; and (c) establishments that operate facilities or provide services that enable patrons to participate in recreational activities or pursue amusement, hobby, and leisure time interests.

The main components of this sector are **performing arts and spectator sports,** museums, historical sites, zoos and parks, amusements, gambling, and recreation **telecommunications indus**-**tries**, and the information services and data processing industries.

The **amusements**, **gambling**, **and recreation** subsector was the largest sector in this industry, accounting for 74.8 percent of employment and 66.3 percent of worksites. The second largest subsector in this industry was **performing arts and spectator sports**, which accounted for 19.2 percent of employment, and 24.8 percent of establishments.

Even though this industry includes gambling establishment, if establishments are casinos with guest accommodation like a hotel, it will be included in the **accommodation and food services** sector.


While this sector took an employment hit during the recession in 2010, the sector has continued to shrink and had less employment in 2014 than in 2010. The sector shrank by 10.3 percent between 2006 and 2014.



2014 Employment in Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation by County






Sector Statewide:
