

Executive Summary

In 2014, the **health care & social assistance** sector comprised 14.2 percent of all employment in lowa (both public and private sector) with 215,526 jobs. The size of this industry has increased steadily over the years, adding 24,582 between 2006 and 2014, meaning 12.9 percent growth over that period. Sector growth remained steady throughout the recession in the midst of that time frame. Wages increased by \$7,382 over the same period, or 21.8 percent.

The sector reported an average annual wage of \$41,273 for 2014, which is essentially about 3.0 percent less than the statewide average of \$42,536. However, average wage varies tremendously between the sub-sectors of the industry with **ambulatory health services** having the highest income of \$59,326 and **nursing & residential care facilities** and **social assistance**, which includes child care centers, earning an average of just \$25,981 and \$20,500, respectively.

Healthcare and social assistance is a female dominated industry, with women possessing 82.7 percent of all jobs.


What is Health Care & Social Assistance?

This firms sector comprises providing health care and social assistance for individuals. The sector includes both health care and social assistance because it is sometimes difficult to distinguish between the boundaries of these two activities. The industries in this sector are arranged on a continuum starting with providing medical care exclusively, continuing with those providing health care and social assistance and finally finishing with only social assistance. The services provided in this sector are delivered by trained health practitioners and workers with social requisite experience.


2014 Industry Breakout by Employment in Iowa


Employers

In 2014 there was an average of 9,561 sector locations in the **health care & social assistance** sector in lowa.

Ambulatory represented the majority of establishments with 5,350 (56.0%). Interestingly, the subsector with the largest amount of employment has the least number of establishments: there are only 250 hospitals in the state, but 67,153 people are employed by them


Social assistance workers are the lowest paid sector, making less than half of the sector average. This subsector includes things like child care centers, family services, and vocational rehab.


