Executive Summary

In 2015, the **health care & social assistance** sector comprised 14.2 percent of all employment in Iowa (both public and private sector) with 217,994 jobs. The size of this industry has increased steadily over the years, adding 27,050 employees between 2006 and 2015, meaning a 12.4 percent growth over that period. Wages increased by \$9,238 over the same period, or 27.3 percent.

The sector reported an average annual wage of \$43,129 for 2015, which is 2.2 percent less than the statewide average of \$44,094. However, average wage varies tremendously between the subsectors of the industry, with ambulatory health services having the highest income of \$61,708 and nursing & residential care facilities and social assistance, which includes child care centers, earning an average of just \$27,142 and \$21,284, respectively.

This sector is a female-dominated industry, with women possessing 82.2 percent of all jobs.





What is Health Care and Social Assistance?

This sector comprises firms providing health care and social assistance for individuals. The sector includes both health care and social assistance because it is sometimes difficult to distinguish between the boundaries of these two activities.


The industries in this sector are arranged on a continuum starting with providing medical care exclusively, continuing with those providing health care and social assistance and finally finishing with only social assistance.

The services provided in this sector are delivered by trained health practitioners and social workers with requisite experience.

Health Care & Social Assistance NAICS Industry Coding


Percentage Employed & Average Annual Wage (AAW) by Sub-Sector



Employers

In 2015, there was an average of 9,838 sector locations in the **health care & social assistance** sector in lowa.


Ambulatory healthcare services represented the majority of establishments with 5,362 (54.5%). Interestingly, the subsector with the largest amount of employment has the least number of establishments: there are only 238 hospitals in the state, but 66,940 people are employed by them.

Social assistance workers are the lowest paid sector, making less than half of the sector average. This subsector includes services such as: child care centers, family services, and vocational rehab.


