

Executive Summary

In 2015, the **utilities** sector comprised 0.5 percent of all public and private sector employment in lowa. Although this sector is one of the state's smallest industries, employing only 8,227 people, it reported an average annual wage of \$81,786. This wage is 85.5 percent higher than the state average yearly wage of \$44,094.

Employment in this sector has steadily regressed since its peak in 2008, although there was a rebound of 1.6 percent from 2013 to 2015. Overall, this sector has shed 717 jobs since its plateauing at 8,944 in 2008, an 8.0 percent decline.

Wages in this sector are generally higher than other industries in lowa because the industry requires a higher level of specialized skills and generally requires substantial overtime. Iowa's wages in this sector are lower than the U.S. average of \$101,445 which is 16.7 percent higher than Iowa's average private sector wage of \$86,919.

Men dominate this industry, holding 76.3 percent of the jobs in the state.






What is Utilities?

The **utilities** sector comprises firms engaged in the provision of the following utility services: electric power, natural gas, steam supply, water supply and sewage removal.

Within this sector, the specific activities associated with the utility services provided vary by utility: electric power includes generation, transmission and distribution: natural aas includes distribution: steam supply includes provision and/or distribution; water supply includes treatment and distribution; and sewage removal includes collection, treatment, and disposal of waste through sewer systems and sewage treatment facilities.

2015 Industry Breakout by Employment in Iowa


Percentage Employed & Average Annual Wage (AAW) by Subsector


Employers

In 2015, lowa averaged 430 **utility** sector establishments across the state, employing 8,227 people.

Electric power generation transmission is by far the largest accounting for subsector, percent of total employment in the sector and 69.1 percent of all locations. This subsector's employees receive the highest amount of compensation in the sector, averaging \$86,503 a year. This is 53.4 percent higher than the subsector with the lowest compensation, water, sewage & other systems, in which employees make \$56,407 per year.


2015 Covered Employment in Utilities


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Industry Distribution by Age & Gender 4th Qtr. 2015
