
THE IMPACT OF LSTA FUNDS IN IOWA Federal Fiscal Year 2016

The State Library of Iowa relies on Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) Grants to States funding from the Institute of Museum and Library Services to deliver statewide library development initiatives and services to Iowa libraries and citizens. This critical funding is tied to matching dollars from the Iowa

Legislature. Iowa received \$1,848,098 for Federal Fiscal Year 2016, which was spent over a grant period from Oct. 1, 2015 to Sept. 30, 2017. Statistics and data in this report reflect State Fiscal Year 2017 (July 1, 2016 – June 30, 2017) unless otherwise noted.


