- The National Council on Aging recently added 20 new Benefits Enrollment Centers (BECs) to its nationwide network of organizations dedicated to helping low-income Medicare beneficiaries get personalized assistance enrolling in programs that pay for health care, prescriptions, food, utilities and more. - The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) will begin mailing new Medicare cards this spring by geographic region, with Iowa's cards scheduled to be mailed sometime after June. The new cards will have new Medicare Beneficiary Identifiers (MBIs) instead of Social Security Number (SSN)-based Health Insurance Claim Numbers (HICNs) to help protect the identities of people with Medicare. Opioid use disorder can affect people of all ages, including older adults who are often prescribed opioids to cope with painful chronic conditions and surgical procedures.
