

- lowa's seasonally adjusted jobless rate remained at 2.7 percent in June.
 The current rate is down from the year ago figure of 3.2 percent.
- The number of employed lowans increased to 1,635,000 in June from 1,629,900 in May.
- The U.S. unemployment rate increased to 4.0 percent in June.


Unemployment Insurance (UI) Benefits Paid Regular UI Benefits (\$ millions)


- Unemployment benefits paid during the fiscal year ending June 2018 totaled \$380 million. This represents a decrease of 11 percent from the fiscal year 2017 payout of \$427 million. The fiscal year 2018 benefit payout was the lowest since fiscal year 2008.
- The number of UI weeks compensated was below one million for the first time since fiscal year 2000.
- Production workers in lowa's construction sector averaged \$1,145.79 in June per week, up \$55.27 versus last year. The increase is primarily due to an increase in overtime hours.
- U.S. total nonfarm payroll added 213,000 jobs in June.

Iowa Total Nonfarm Employment January 2017 - June 2018



- Total nonfarm employment added jobs for the second consecutive month in June, gaining 3,400 jobs. Much of the gain was due to seasonal hiring in local government related to summer programs.
- Private industry changed little compared to May, adding just 500 jobs.
- Construction expanded again in June (+900) and has now added jobs in every month since February. This sector is now positive annually for the first time since November 2016.
- Losses were small this month and included 600 in professional and business services.
- lowa has added 15,900 jobs over the past twelve months. The largest gains have been in manufacturing (+9,800) and professional and business services (+2,600).
