## Lottery Guarantees One-of-a-Kind Hawkeye Victory ${ }^{\circledR}$ This Season!

The Iowa Lottery can guarantee a one-of-a-kind Hawkeye Victory ${ }^{\circledR}$ this season.

The lottery teamed up with three Iowa companies to design a custom-painted motorcycle in Iowa Hawkeye black-and-gold that will be given away in a promotion that runs through midOctober.

The Victory Vegas Motorcycle was provided for the "Hawkeye Victory" promotion by Victory Motorcycles, a division of Polaris Industries in Spirit Lake; and Van Wall Motorsports in Ankeny. A made-to-order paint job for the bike was donated by Custom Paint Specialists of Des Moines. The paint design includes the Iowa Hawkeye logo; an image of Herky, the Hawkeyes' mascot; Iowa's Flying Tiger Hawk; the University of Iowa seal; and a view of Kinnick Stadium, Iowa's football stadium in Iowa City.
The Hawkeye Victory motorcycle was debuted to the public for the first time Sept. 9 at the Polk County Hawkeye Huddle in Clive and was on display at the Iowa vs. Northern Iowa football game on Sept. 17.

The Hawkeye Victory promotion began Sept. 16 and runs through midnight on Saturday, Oct. 15. Lottery players who buy $\$ 5$ or more in any lotto game on one ticket and don't win a prize can use the ticket to enter the promotion through the lottery's Web site at www.ialottery.com. Players can key in the serial number from their tickets to

enter the promotion and need to keep each ticket they use to enter. The eligible games for the promotion are: Powerball, Hot Lotto, Iowa's \$100,000 Cash Game, Pick 4 and Pick 3.

The Lottery will hold a drawing on Oct. 18 to determine the motorcycle winner and the player selected will need to take his/her ticket to lottery headquarters in Des Moines to claim the bike!

Lottery spokesperson Mary Neubauer said that the lottery has worked with the broadcast networks carrying both Iowa and Iowa State football and basketball games to design promotions and will be running an Iowa State-related promotion during the upcoming college basketball season.

## Don’t Fret Over Powerball, Hot Lotto Mistake Tickets

Everybody makes mistakes. Even if your mistake happens to be a Powerball or Hot Lotto play made in error, it doesn't have to be the end of the world!
Let's review the steps you must take to handle a "mistake" Powerball or Hot Lotto ticket.

If the ticket did not print or the ticket is misprinted or mutilated so it can't be validated:

- The defective play must be confirmed by immediately producing a REPRINT ticket.
- Call the SGI hotline at 800-858-4744. They will provide you with a Control Number. They'll also help you get the information needed to report the problem to the lottery and, if necessary, help you produce the REPRINT ticket.
- Any or all parts of the defective ticket, along with the REPRINT ticket and Control Number, must be returned to the lottery in the retailer settlement envelope.
- When the lottery receives the defective ticket and the REPRINT ticket, we'll examine it and then issue credit to the retailer for the cost of the ticket. You can't receive credit if you don't follow the first three steps!
If the ticket is printed correctly by the terminal, but the clerk or the player makes an error:
- Call the SGI hotline to report the problem and correct ticket information. A Control Number will be
provided.
- Remember, the ticket is still valid and can be sold. If you can't sell the ticket, validate it for any prizes won on the ticket after all draws have passed. Then send the ticket and the control number to the lottery in the retailer settlement envelope. The lottery will credit you for the cost of the ticket less any winnings.
The most common reasons for denying credit:

1) The retailer did not call SGI.
2) No ticket or play was sent to the lottery.
In short, if you don't follow the steps outlined above, you are out of luck!

Think about this: why not sell the ticket? Unless the problem ticket is a mutilated ticket, why not try to sell it to one of your other customers? Especially during busy, high-jackpot times, your customers may be more willing to take that ticket than stand in line. GAME INFORMATION
