## Proposed Lead & Copper Rule – Long-term Revisions Announced Today

EPA announced the long-awaited proposed Lead & Copper Rule – Long-term Revisions, now called Lead & Copper Rule Revisions (LCRR) today. The proposed rule will be published in the Federal Register in the next few days, and will have a 60-day comment period following publication. ## State Revolving Fund FY 2019 Annual Report Now Available

*October 4, 2019*

The fiscal year [2019 Annual Report for the Iowa State Revolving Fund](#) is now available. The Iowa SRF has provided almost \$3.6 billion in cumulative assistance as of SFY 2019 and continues to be an effective and cost-efficient mechanism for financing projects to protect water quality and public health.

Iowa's SRF issues two documents each year for the Clean Water SRF and the Drinking Water SRF: The Intended Use Plans (IUPs) at the beginning of the year outline the goals and objectives for each program area, and the Annual Reports at the end of the year show results and accomplishments and how well the goals and objectives were met. Detailed information is included in the Clean Water SRF and Drinking Water SRF Annual Report which follow, covering July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019.
