



Resources for Iowa's Creative Sector

As you know, the coronavirus outbreak has created a lot of ripple effects for artists, filmmakers, nonprofits and creative businesses. There are a lot of resources, too.

Iowa Arts & Culture Emergency Relief Fund

We have created a new Iowa Arts & Culture Emergency Relief Fund for Iowa artists and cultural nonprofits, with a relatively quick timeline. The first window of applications will open Monday, April 13, and close Friday, April 17. An online application and guidelines will be posted by noon on Monday at iowaculture.gov.

National Endowment for the Arts Updates

Through the CARES Act and an appropriation from the National Endowment for the Arts, the Iowa Arts Council will receive an additional \$442,700 in operating support funds to grant to eligible Iowa nonprofit arts and culture organizations impacted by the coronavirus outbreak. Additional details will be forthcoming soon. In addition, the National Endowment for the Arts released its CARES Act Funding guidelines for direct grants this week. All applicants must be previous National Endowment for the Arts award recipients during the past four years. More information and guidelines can be found at arts.gov.

Extended Deadlines


Economic Impact Survey

According to our partners at Americans for the Arts, the coronavirus outbreak has cost 190 Iowa arts and cultural organizations an estimated \$2.04 million, with an average loss of \$10,800 per organization. More than 90 percent of individual artists have lost income. Please take 5 minutes to complete [this survey](#). Last year, the Iowa Arts Council distributed grants to the [Iowa Ceramics Center](#) for workshops that helped immigrants tell their stories through art, to [Community Support Advocates' "Momentum Artrepreneur"](#) program to connect artists of all ability levels to mentorships and business training, and to the [Des Moines Art Center](#) for its ongoing work as a Cultural Leadership Partner.
