Bureau of HIV, STD, and Hepatitis

Who We Are

The Bureau of HIV, STD, and Hepatitis works to reduce the impact of these communicable diseases in Iowa and to eliminate the morbidity associated with these diseases. We monitor the burden of these diseases throughout the state and fund prevention and care services through a network of contracted local public health agencies, clinics, and community-based organizations.

What We Do

Our Services

Counseling, Testing, and Referral

- Offer a convenient opportunity for high-risk and disproportionately impacted populations to learn their HIV, STD, and Hepatitis statuses;
- Provide a means to receive counseling to help initiate behavior change to avoid infection or if already infected, to prevent transmission to others; and
- Give referrals to additional prevention programs, medical care, and other needed services.

Partner Services

- Assist persons newly diagnosed with HIV and other STDs in identifying their sex and needle-sharing partners;
- Confidentially inform sex and needle-sharing partners of their possible exposure to HIV or other STDs, or assist infected persons in informing their partners directly;
- Provide partners with client-centered prevention counseling that assists and supports them in efforts to reduce the risk of HIV or other STDs and unintended pregnancy or, if infected, of transmitting HIV or other STDs; and
- Minimize or delay disease progression/transmission by identifying persons who may have been exposed to HIV or other STDs as early as possible in the course of infection and assisting them in obtaining appropriate preventative, medical, and other support services.

HIV Support Services

- Manage comprehensive case management system for persons living with HIV;
- Provide services, referrals, or funds for core medical services for persons living with HIV including ambulatory health, oral health, mental health, outpatient substance abuse, or medication adherence;
- Provide outreach services, psychosocial support, transportation, linguistic services, and other referrals as necessary;
- Assess for appropriate medical benefits home for all persons living with HIV; and
- Assist with enrollment in health insurance coverage and the AIDS Drug Assistance Program.

AIDS Drug Assistance Program

- Provide anti-retroviral medications for persons living with HIV in Iowa who meet income guidelines;
- Assist with health insurance costs, such as prescription deductibles, co-payments, and monthly premiums for persons living with HIV; and
- Provide medications to support optimum health outcomes, such as tobacco cessation aids and hepatitis C medications, for persons living with HIV.

Surveillance and Data Management

- Oversee data gathering such as demographic and behavioral indicators, prevalence monitoring, and electronic data transmissions for HIV and other reportable STDs;
- Generate epidemiological reports on HIV and other STDs for health professionals, legislators, media, and the public; and
- Conduct outbreak investigations when appropriate.

Program Evaluation

• Evaluate reporting, prevention, and care activities in community-based and governmental organizations, conduct annual evaluations of all HIV and STD prevention and care activities, and provide technical assistance as necessary.

Our Goals

Human Immunodeficiency Virus

- Increase the number of persons living with HIV who know their status and are in care:
- Decrease new HIV infections;
- Increase access to services for persons living with HIV;
- Increase the coordination and collaboration between various governmental and communitybased programs that address the myriad needs of persons living with HIV;
- Reduce disproportionate diagnoses of HIV among racial and ethnic minorities; and
- Ensure that consistently high quality services are provided to lowans living with HIV.

Sexually Transmitted Disease

- Increase the number of STDinfected persons who are aware of their infections:
- Reduce STD transmission to prevent new infections;
- Reduce the risks associated with STD transmission and acquisition;
- Reduce the health care consequences and financial burdens of undetected and untreated STD infections; and
- Reduce disproportionate incidence of STDs among racial and ethnic minorities and among youth.


Hepatitis

- Increase the number of HCVinfected persons who know their status;
- Reduce HCV transmission to prevent new infections;
- Provide adult hepatitis immunizations;
- Reduce HCV risk behaviors; and
- Provide appropriate referrals for HCV-positive persons.


Why We Do It

Screening and prevention save lives and money.

By the age of 25, half of all sexually active young adults will have contracted an STD. STD rates have nearly doubled in Iowa since 2000, and infectious syphilis cases have increased 450% since 2011. It is estimated that only 50% of all STD cases are diagnosed due to lack of symptoms common with chlamydia and gonorrhea.




There are an estimated 2,614 individuals living with HIV in Iowa, approximately 15.8% of whom do not know they are infected. Of those who are diagnosed, only 65% have viral suppression – a low enough level of virus in the blood to significantly decrease mortality and transmission risk. Individuals who do not know their status and those who are diagnosed but not in medical care contribute to ~100 new HIV infections in Iowa every year.



The points along this "continuum of care" indicate the number of individuals at each stage, with viral suppression being the ultimate goal of treatment. Our HIV prevention and care services are designed to raise all of these bars, so every individual living with HIV in Iowa is aware of their infection, in care, and virally suppressed.

An estimated 49,000 lowans are currently infected with hepatitis C. The bureau is currently working to establish a hepatitis C surveillance system to encourage these individuals to be tested and treated. New medications have revolutionized hepatitis C treatment and now offer the hope of a cure to lowans living with hepatitis C.

Diagnosing and treating HIV, STD, and hepatitis early prevents long-term complications, costlier treatments, and new infections.
