

IOWA STUDENT READERS RECOGNIZED FOR LETTERS ABOUT LITERATURE AWARDS PROGRAM

DES MOINES — The Iowa Center for the Book honored 18 student readers from across Iowa as winners and honorable mentions for the 2020 Iowa Letters About Literature awards program at a virtual ceremony on Friday, May 1.

Due to the COVID-19 crisis, the recognition ceremony was moved to an online format. State Librarian Michael Scott gave an address and the winning letters in each level were read by Angie Manfredi, State Library Youth Services Consultant, while a slide recognizing the student was displayed. A recording of the recognition ceremony will be posted to the lowa Center for the Book website for viewing soon.

"We celebrate and congratulate the 2020 Letters About Literature winners and honorable mentions," said Michael Scott, State Librarian of Iowa. "Their creativity and ability to connect a meaningful book to their life experience has had an impact on me and I'm sure many others. I know the future is bright for these students."

Letters About Literature is a statewide literary contest where student readers write a letter to an author of a book that has changed their view of themselves or their world. The 18 winners and honorable mentions were chosen from nearly 600 entries from students across lowa.
