### Last Chance for 2020 Industrial Stormwater Training

One final session of The Bottom Line on Industrial Stormwater, a webinar aimed at holders of NPDES General Permits 1 and 3, will be held Wednesday, June 10. This will be the last opportunity to receive this training in 2020.

This webinar has been developed to help those facilities understand their permitting requirements, develop pollution prevention plans, and implement best management practices with the goal of staying in compliance.

The training will be conducted by webinar due to concerns about inperson training related to the COVID-19 pandemic. Within the webinar format, participants will have ample opportunity to interact with presenters and get their questions answered.
