# Disaster Assistance for Black Hawk, Fayette, and Van Buren Counties

Governor Kim Reynolds issued disaster proclamations for the counties of <u>Black Hawk</u>, 6/25/20), <u>Fayette</u>, <u>and Van Buren</u> (6/29/20).

The governor's proclamations allow state resources to be utilized to respond to and recover from the effects of this severe weather and activates the Iowa Individual Assistance Grant Program for qualifying residents, along with the Disaster Case Management Program.

#### <u>**Iowa Individual Assistance Grant Program**</u>

The lowa Individual Assistance Grant Program provides grants of up to \$5,000 for households with incomes up to 200 percent of the federal poverty level or a maximum annual income of \$43,440 for a family of three. Grants are available for home or car repairs, replacement of clothing or food, and temporary housing expenses. Original receipts are required for those seeking reimbursement for actual expenses related to storm recovery. The grant application and instructions are available on the lowa Department of Human Services website. Potential applicants have 45 days from the date of the proclamation to submit a claim. #### **Iowa Disaster Case Management**

Disaster Case Management is a program to address serious needs to overcome a disaster-related hardship, injury or adverse condition. Disaster case managers work with clients to create a disaster recovery plan and provide guidance, advice and referral to obtain a service or resource. **There are no income eligibility requirements for this program**; it closes 180 days from the date of the governor's proclamation. # **July is National Minority Mental Health Awareness Month**



The <u>U.S. Health and Human Services Office of Minority Health</u> notes that according to the <u>Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality</u>, minorities are less likely to receive diagnosis and treatment for their mental illness, have less access to mental health services and often receive a poorer quality of mental health care. National Mental Health Awareness Month (July) is a time to raise awareness of mental illness and improve access to mental health treatment and services for underrepresented communities. According to the <u>National Alliance on Mental Illness</u> (NAMI), our culture, beliefs, sexual identity, values, race and language all affect how we perceive and experience mental health conditions. Cultural differences can influence what treatments, coping mechanisms and supports work for us.

The coronavirus pandemic can cause additional stress, anxiety, financial distress, and feelings of isolation. It is important to practice self-care and get help when you need it.

Before heading to a Test Iowa location, you must first complete an online assessment at the Test Iowa website at <a href="https://www.testiowa.com">https://www.testiowa.com</a>. You will then receive instructions on your scheduled appointment and location. The test is free and available to Iowans wishing to get tested, regardless of symptoms or potential exposure.
