The number of African American families in 2018 who reside in Iowa. Of these families, 76.2 percent include their own children under 18 years of age.



The African American population in five counties: Polk, Scott, Linn, Black Hawk, and Johnson in 2017. this accounts for 68.5% of the total African American population in Iowa.

Over half of the growth in lowa's African American population from 2010-2018 occurred in three counties: Polk, Linn and Johnson.

The percent of the African American population living in Des Moines. Des Moines has the largest population (24,356) of African Americans in any city in Iowa.


